S.B. 474 PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE V, SECTION 6, OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION, TO CLARIFY THE GUBERNATORIAL APPOINTMENT PROCESS

Chair Taniguchi, Vice Chair Takamine, and members of the Committee:

The Office of the Governor **opposes** S.B. 474. This bill would amend the State Constitution to change the appointment process for department heads and members of boards and commissions by requiring the Governor to nominate successors within the time limit required by law.

This measure unnecessarily limits the Governor's appointment power. This is simply another bill in a long line of measures attempting to thwart the ability of this Governor to manage the Executive Branch.

The measure provides that the Governor must nominate a successor "within the time limit required by law". A statutory time limit could be unreasonably short and could hinder the selection of qualified candidates by the Governor and would be detrimental to good government operations. The Office of the Governor must oppose S.B. 474.
