Subject: Testimory in Support of SB534

Thank you for holding a hearing on this important legislation which would provide clarification to our current election laws, particularly in the case of the withdrawal of a candidate just prior to the filing deadline.

While other Bills have been introduced in an attempt to address the various issues that arose during this last election cycle, I believe the language in SB 534 will provide a more comprehensive up date to the existing law by automatically extending the filing deadline by five calendar days in the event there is a late withdrawal, creating an uncontested race.

In particular, SB534 addresses a possible "domino effect" should candidates enter races at the last minute. This legislation is designed to minimize the potential for uncontested elections. By moving the filing deadline back a few weeks, this bill also provides even more time for the Office of Elections to perform all required tasks prior to an election.
