Aloha Chair Espero, Vice Chair Bunda and Members of the Committee!

My name is Kat Brady and I am the Coordinator of Community Alliance on Prisons, a community initiative working to improve conditions of confinement for our incarcerated individuals, enhance our quality of justice, and promote public safety. We come today to speak for the 6,000+ individuals whose voices have been silenced by incarceration, always mindful that more than 2,000 of those individuals are serving their sentences abroad, thousands of miles from their homes and loved ones.

SB 539 reorganizes and renames the Corrections Program Services Division of PSD to the Reentry Services Division, whereby the Reentry Services Division will work closely with the furlough programs in each county that are managed by the Institutions Division to ensure that reentry needs of inmates are being met.

Community Alliance on Prisons is in strong support of SB 539.

Act 8 mandated a change in the Department of Public Safety's mission to focus on rehabilitation and reentry. This bill codifies that the Department will continue to focus on reentry from day one of an individual's incarceration.

We ask the Committee to pass SB 539. Mahalo for this opportunity to testify.
