Thank you for the opportunity to testify. On behalf of the business owners who make up the membership of the National Federation of Independent Business in Hawaii, we ask that you **support** SB 581. NFIB supports this measure.

The National Federation of Independent Business is the largest advocacy organization representing small and independent businesses in Washington, D.C., and all 50 state capitals. In Hawaii, NFIB represents more than 1,000 members. NFIB's purpose is to impact public policy at the state and federal level and be a key business resource for small and independent business in America. Small-business owners have expressed concern about uses of government's power to condemn property under "eminent domain." Small-business owners are already struggling under the weight of government regulations. NFIB Hawaii supports measures such as this one which would address our members' concerns
