Senate Bill 786, Senate Draft 1 would make the entering or remaining unlawfully on property listed in the Hawaii Register of Historic Places after warning or request to leave, an offense of criminal trespass in the First Degree. This bill would also makes the intentional or knowing damage to property on the Hawaii Register of Historic Places an offense of criminal property damage in the First Degree. The Department of Land and Natural Resources strongly supports this measure, and appreciates the Senate's support of historic preservation in Hawaii.

Subject: Support of SB786, Relating to Historic Places

On behalf of Historic Hawai'i Foundation (HHF), I am writing to support SB786SD1, which increases criminal penalties for trespass upon and vandalism of properties on the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places.
