- 1 **Department's Position:** The department appreciates the intent of this bill, but must respectfully oppose
- 2 it as currently drafted.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: Significant additional work hours and expenses will be required which cannot be
- 4 absorbed at the current staffing levels. These expenses are estimated at \$46,000 for year 1 and
- 5 additional annual operating expenses of \$34,000.
- 6 Purpose and Justification: The bill will require the Department of Health (DOH) and the Department
- of Human Services (DHS) to post inspection results from licensing surveys and complaint investigations
- 8 onto the respective DOH and DHS websites for care facilities each department licenses. The state
- 9 licenses approximately 600 ARCHs, nursing homes, developmental disabilities domiciliary homes, and
- assisted living facilities that would be affected by this bill in addition to licensing many other facilities
- such as hospitals, clinical laboratories, ambulatory surgical centers, home health agencies, etc. The
- significant volume of providers and associated surveys, lists of deficiencies, and plans of correction of
- approximately 61,000 pages per year will require significant additional work hours which cannot be
- absorbed at current staffing levels. Funding does not exist to cover the additional costs. The Centers for
- 15 Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) currently requires nursing facilities to make available to current

- and potential patients the licensing results, list of deficiencies and plan of correction in hard copy form
- at the facility. As a result, the practicalities of the current funding environment preclude any ability to
- 3 implement the bill's requirements and CMS requirements on nursing facilities makes this bill
- 4 unnecessary for nursing facilities.

Chair Donna Mercado Kim, Vice Chair Shan S. Tsutsui, Vice Chair and Members of the Committee on Ways and Means,

We are submitting testimony on behalf of HARA in support of SB 818, SD1. HARA has nine affiliates, listed on this letterhead, representing 21,000 members.

The purpose of this bill is to require the Department of Health and the Department of Human Services to make available to the public free of charge, information collected from the departments' inspections of care facilities. We concur wholeheartedly with this purpose.

Anyone who has had the experience of finding a suitable care facilities for a love one with a few days notice from a doctor or a medical facility will understand how difficult and trying that experience really is. Which care facility from among a whole listing of facilities will be most suitable from our loved one? Providing inspection reports on line will be very helpful to make the difficult placement decision.

HARA urges the Senate Committee on Ways and Means to approve SB 818, SD 1 and consider setting an earlier effective date than January 1, 2011, which is way too long, considering the creative talents of the DOH and DHS. Mahalo.

SUBJECT: SB 818 SD1 – RELATING TO HEALTH

The position and views expressed in this testimony do not represent nor reflect the position and views of the Departments of Health (DOH) and Human Services (DHS).

The State Council on Developmental Disabilities (DD) **SUPPORTS SB 818 SD1**. The purpose of the bill is to require DOH and DHS to post on their respective websites reports of all inspections of care facilities by January 1, 2011.

The provisions of this bill increases the ability of the public to obtain inspection reports of care facilities, and the transparency for the public to know which care facilities are not meeting standards, which ones meet minimal standards, and those that go beyond the minimal standards. This information could also be linked with the Aging and Disability Resource Center that is developing a single entry point for information and resources for the elder and disability population.
