Chair Ige and Members of the Committee:

The Attorney General strongly supports this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to amend section 338-18(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to authorize the Department of Health to permit law enforcement officers to inspect public health statistics records and for the Department of Health to issue a certified copy of any such record or part thereof to law enforcement.

During the course of investigating or prosecuting a crime, law enforcement officers may need access to vital statistics records. For example, in a homicide investigation, access to a death certificate may help determine what charge, if any, to bring against a suspect.

Another example is the need to access birth certificates in sexual assault cases to ascertain the age of the victim or suspect.

Permitting law enforcement officers access to public health statistics records - provided that the officer submits a signed statement verifying, under penalty of criminal prosecution, that the vital statistics records are needed as evidence in a criminal investigation - will allow for more timely investigation of crimes when such records are needed, while protecting the privacy of the records.

We respectfully request passage of this measure.

The Honorable Chairpersons and Committee Members:

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney for the County of Maui supports S.B. 844 Relating to the Disclosure of Vital Statistics Records to Law Enforcement Officers.

This proposed bill seeks to statutorily allow law enforcement officers access to certain public health records in order to facilitate criminal investigations. This type of information is needed, for example, when the age of the victim is relevant in determining the appropriate charge(s) to file.

In addition, the information may also be needed when an accused who is now deceased, still has pending charges outstanding. Under this circumstance, our Department would not dismiss any charges until we receive confirmation via the death certificate.

In closing, we strongly recommend passage of this bill as it provides law enforcement the much needed authority to obtain these types of records. Accordingly, our Department supports S.B. 844. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.
