Chair Taniguchi and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General strongly supports this bill.

This bill will change the validity period of Hawaii State

Identification cards from six years to eight years, for cards issued

after the effective date of this measure. This change will make State

Identification cards consistent with Hawaii driver's licenses, which

expire eight years after issuance (effective November 1, 2008).

Additionally, states are exploring compliance with the REAL ID Act of

2005; the REAL ID Act implementing rules require that the validity

period of driver's licenses and state identification cards not exceed

eight years.

This bill will also delete the provisions for transitioning from expiration based on issuance date to expiration based on birth date, because there is no longer a need for these transitioning provisions.

The League of Women Voters supports SB 856 which would extend the expiration date of certificates of identification from six years to eight years and seems to simplify and clarify the transition of the expiration date to people's birthday.
