My name is Roy Ogawa and I would like to thank the Committee for this opportunity to provide written testimony in support of SCR 155. I am one of three Commissioners from the State of Hawaii and the past Chair of the 15 state Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education I support this resolution as it recognizes that WICHE has done and continues to do much more than operate a professional student exchange program which it has run effectively for decades to support Hawaii students in obtaining professional degrees in programs that are unavailable in Hawaii. It has also gone forward with developing and supporting both undergraduate and graduate exchange programs with little cost to the state other than its membership dues. The University of Hawaii has also participated in and supported these programs in accepting exchange students at reduced out of state tuition fees. Last year the Community Colleges consented to participation in the exchange programs.
