Testimony in Strong Support

Chair Yamane and Vice Chair Nishimoto, and members of the Committee on Health. My name is George Massengale and on behalf of the American Cancer Society Hawaii Pacific Inc., we are offering this testimony in strong support of SCR170.

The American Cancer Society Hawaii Pacific Inc. was formed in 1959, and is a community-based, voluntary health organization dedicated to eliminating cancer as a major health problem by preventing cancer, saving lives, and diminishing suffering from cancer, through research, education, advocacy, and service. This also includes advocating for public health policies that improve our access to health care.

Two years ago the American Cancer Society launched a Health Access Campaign to foster debate on how to fix problems with our current health care structure. We believe that convening a Hawaii Health Care Summit is the first step in addressing the complexities of health care reform.

Although the Society does not endorse any particular plan for healthcare reform, we do believe that the health care summit focus on four key principles in defining health care in Hawaii:

- Adequate: People must have timely access to the full range of health care, including prevention and early detection.
- **Affordable:** Health care cost should be based on the patient's ability to pay.
- Available: Our residents need to have coverage no matter what their health status is or what treatments they've had in the past.
- Administratively simple: The health care process should be easy to understand and navigate.

We truly believe that if a concerted effort were undertaken to develop a comprehensive health care plan in Hawaii we would be able to provide quality health care to all our residents regardless of insurance status, or current medical condition and need.
