Purpose of Resolution:

Requesting the Department of Education to implement simple, cost-effective practices that encourage energy conservation in the

Department's Position:

The Department of Education (DOE) does not support SCR 191(SR119).

DOE has already implemented energy conservation programs in the work place and maintains an informational webpage. The DOE has informed schools and offices on practices that conserve energy - such as turning off lights and computers, resetting air conditioning hours and thermostats, and removing personal appliances.

An energy conservation program was implemented in school year 2007-2008. This program established a baseline of energy consumption based upon kilowatt hours during a 36 month period from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2006. Schools that reduce their consumption below the allocated kilowatt hours will receive half the value of the savings; schools that fail to reduce their consumption below the allocated amount will be charged for half the value of the kilowatt hours used above the allocated amount.

The DOE is committed to improving its energy conservation effort through constant reviews and updates of its energy conservation strategies.
