REQUESTING THE OBAMA ADMINISTRATION TO HOST A UNITED NATIONS CLIMATE CHANGE CONFERENCE IN HAWAI'I

STRONGLY SUPPORT

I'm Shannon Wood speaking on behalf of the *Windward Ahupua`a Alliance* in strong support of <u>SCR 74/SR 45</u> which helps set in motion the possibility that Hawai`i could host a <u>UN Climate Change Conference</u> in 2010.

For the past three years, *WAA* has been working on climate change policies - including being part of a national advocacy team. Part of my job is to keep up with what's happening all around the world with respect to the steps involved in negotiating an international agreement on climate change when the 1997 Kyoto Protocol expires in 2012.

Later this year, there will be three international climate change conferences. In April, leaders from 16 major economies will come to Washington for a preparatory session which will be followed by a summit in Italy in July to work towards a *United Nations* agreement on cutting greenhouse gas emissions to replace the <u>Kyoto Protocols</u>. This agreement will be signed in December at the Copenhagen conference.

Additional climate change conferences will be held in the run-up to 2012. This resolution will request **President** Barack Obama to offer Hawai`i as a logical place to hold an international scientific & policy conference in 2010. His chief science advisor, John Holden, and Todd Stern, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton's climate change envoy, would be involved in the discussions.

Not only would such a conference showcase what we are doing here in Hawai'l both in terms of academic research along with the major steps we're taking to reduce our own greenhouse gas emissions but also it would be an needed boost to our economy which has taken a number of hits over the past 15 months. As the resolution states, we have everything needed to put on an event of this magnitude in one of the world's most beautiful places. We're also going to be directly impacted by climate change policy decisions which will be negotiated over the three years.

When I brought the resolution request to *Senator* Jill Tokuda and *Representative* Chris Lee, I suggested that it be directed to the *President* Obama by way of our **Congressional** delegation rather than just sending them a copy. If you feel that it would strengthen the resolution to actively include them in the process, I certainly would have no objection. In any case, I've contacted their offices to notify that the resolution is making its way through the legislative process.

Of course, it doesn't hurt that President Obama himself has a few ties to Hawai'i!
