Public Utilities Commission State of Hawaii

 Regulation of Public Utilities:
Public utilities required to provide customers with reliable services at just and reasonable rates

 Provide regulated companies with a fair opportunity to earn a reasonable rate of return

- Commission Created by Statute, HRS Ch. 269
- Functions of Commission
 - Quasi-Judicial
 - Rule-Making
 - Administrative

6 year staggered terms

 Governor Appointed, Senate Confirmed

Commission General Powers and Duties

 General supervisory power over public utilities under Chapter 269, HRS. HRS §269-6(a).

 Broad investigative powers to examine public utilities. HRS §269-7(a).

Commission Investigative Proceeding

 Investigation formally opened on January 12, 2009, Docket No. 2009-0005

- Parties:
 - HECO

- Consumer Advocate



Preliminary Issues in Investigation

- What caused the power outage?
- If caused by lightning, could HECO have reasonably prevented the power outage from initially occurring?
- Through reasonable measures, could HECO have prevented the power outage or prevented it from becoming island-wide?
- Could HECO have reasonably shortened the power outage and restored power more quickly to customers?
- How can HECO prevent and minimize similar power outages, and improve its response to power outages in the future?
- What penalties, if any, should be imposed on HECO?

Initial Procedural Deadlines

- HECO to file all power outage briefing materials within 15 days.
- Deadline to intervene is 20 days from opening of investigation. HAR § 6-61-57(3)(B).

 Proposed prehearing schedule due 15 days after intervention deadline; or 30 days after an order addressing any motions to intervene.
