SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Evans, seconded by Representative Pine and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering a certain House bill for Third Reading by consent calendar. (Representatives Takai, Wakai and Wooley were excused.)

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

H.B. No. 1175, HD 3:

Representative B. Oshiro moved that H.B. No. 1175, HD 3, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative M. Oshiro rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in strong support of House Bill 1175, House Draft 3. Mr. Speaker, just a couple of points. This was a short form bill, introduced on behalf and at the request of Governor Linda Lingle. The bill, as proposed would raise the cigarette tax from 10 cents per cigarette, to 14 cents per cigarette. This is a tobacco tax increase.

"The bill as amended would raise the cigarette tax from 10 cents per cigarette, to 20 cents per cigarette. As originally proposed from the Governor's Office, the bill would generate for fiscal year 2010, \$42 million in additional tax revenue. In fiscal year 2011, \$25.1 million in additional tax revenue. In fiscal year 2012, \$14.4 million in additional tax revenue.

"When we calculated the increase from 10 cents to 20 cents, for fiscal year 2010, it would generate an additional \$80 million in tax revenue. Supportive testimony came in from two department heads, from Budget and Finance, and I think it's worth reading, and I quote, 'We support moving this bill forward to foster continued discussions during these difficult times, and considering the grave fiscal conditions we are facing, all options must be kept open. While it is recognized that this bill may be unpopular, we will need to make difficult decisions to address our budget shortfall and ensure the fiscal health of our State.' This is submitted by Director Georgina Kawamura, on March 2nd.

"We also did receive favorable testimony from the Department of Taxation. This measure is effective July 1, 2020. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Thielen rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'm also rising to speak in support of this measure. Mr. Speaker, I'm in strong support, both on the health side, and then for our children. I think that when we raise the price of cigarettes, we lessen the number of people that are going to be addicted to cigarettes. Thank you."

Representative Pine rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Yes, in support, Mr. Speaker. I would just like to thank the Finance Chair for reminding us that this is a tax increase on just cigarettes, because I definitely could not support any tax increases that would affect everyone, like increasing taxes on healthcare, and increasing the general excise tax, which would definitely hurt Hawaii's population. Thank you."

Representative Finnegan rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative M. Lee rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'd just like to stand in support of this measure. Actually, I think we should be happy to support it, because it's a really important public health issue, and it's been shown, time after time that raising the tax on cigarettes decreases the amount of smoking. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 1175, HD 3, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TAXATION," passed Third Reading by a vote of 48 ayes, with Representatives Takai, Wakai and Wooley being excused.

At 12:31 o'clock p.m., the Chair noted that the following bill passed Third Reading:

At 12:31 o'clock p.m. Representative Finnegan requested a recess and the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:38 o'clock p.m.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Labor & Public Employment presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 977) recommending that S.B. No. 823, SD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Economic Revitalization, Business, & Military Affairs.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 823, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Economic Revitalization, Business, & Military Affairs with Representatives Luke, Takai, Wakai and Wooley being excused.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Labor & Public Employment presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 978) recommending that S.B. No. 695, SD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 695, SD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Pine rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"I rise with support, but with some reservations. This relates to workers' compensation. And my only reservation is from being on the Finance Committee, the Department of Labor estimated that to start this new program, it would cost almost half a million dollars, and then almost another half a million dollars in salary every year thereafter. So, I don't think it's time to start new programs right now."

Representative Finnegan rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ching rose in support of the measure with reservations and asked that the remarks of Representative Pine be entered into the Journal as her own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Thielen rose in support of the measure with reservations and asked that the remarks of Representative Pine be entered into the Journal as her own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Marumoto rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'll be voting 'no' on this bill on Second Reading. It will provide continuous medical care to an employee. And, even if a doctor has already determined that further medical care is unnecessary, it will call for a hearing to take place in the Department of Labor. I think it really should be a doctor's determination whether a worker could go back to work or not.

"If the medical care is unnecessary, then it will needlessly raise the cost of workers' compensation insurance. So, that is the reason I am voting 'no.'"

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise with reservations. Now is the time that we want to maintain as many jobs as possible. Yesterday, or the day before, we just got a new report that it's 6.1 percent unemployment. Some of our Neighbor Island colleagues have 7, 8 percent, even higher than that.

"Anything that creates more straws on the camel, i.e. the unemployment camel, that causes businesses to release employees is not good policy. This is not the time for this, as my colleague said, it expands government. Now is the time to keep our people employed. And anything, any gesture that we send, or any bill that we pass that jeopardizes the employees of the

State of Hawaii, is not good policy. And that's why I have serious reservations. Thank you."

Representative Evans rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I stand in support. Since I've been at the Legislature, so many times I've heard the terminology 'children first.' I really believe this bill is about 'worker first.' And I really encourage us to move this along for discussion, because if a worker has been hurt, and they're in pain and suffering, maybe a doctor believes they should go back to work. But the way we've set it up, is we've got our department, they have the ability to go in front of the hearing, and get a ruling. It gives an opportunity due justice to the worker to talk about their pain and suffering. I think it's a legitimate process, and I encourage us to vote it along. Thank you."

Representative Rhoads rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in support. The countervailing argument is that workers who are injured and who have legitimate claims, and don't get continuous medical services are the ones who are most likely to cost the system more in the long run. If you have gaps in your medical coverage, that can be a very severe problem, depending on what your ailments are. So, I think this is an important step forward.

"In regards to the economic argument, it will help the economy, because it will keep doctors employed and medical providers, so I think that cuts both ways. Mahalo."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 695, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance with Representatives Finnegan and Marumoto voting no, and with Representatives Luke, Takai, Wakai and Wooley being excused.

Representatives McKelvey and Hanohano, for the Committee on Economic Revitalization, Business, & Military Affairs and the Committee on Public Safety presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 979), recommending that H.R. No. 14, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and H.R. No. 14, HD 1, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE ADJUTANT GENERAL TO IDENTIFY THE LOCATION OF EVERY PUBLIC SAFE ROOM IN THE COUNTY OF HAWAII PROVIDING SUITABLE SHELTER FROM VOG AND DEVELOP PLANS TO ESTABLISH SUCH SAFE ROOMS IN ADDITIONAL AREAS THAT NEED THEM," was referred to the Committee on Finance with Representatives Luke, Takai, Wakai and Wooley being excused.

Representatives McKelvey and Hanohano, for the Committee on Economic Revitalization, Business, & Military Affairs and the Committee on Public Safety presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 980), recommending that H.C.R. No. 10, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative B. Oshiro, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and H.C.R. No. 10, HD 1, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE ADJUTANT GENERAL TO IDENTIFY THE LOCATION OF EVERY PUBLIC SAFE ROOM IN THE COUNTY OF HAWAII PROVIDING SUITABLE SHELTER FROM VOG AND DEVELOP PLANS TO ESTABLISH SUCH SAFE ROOMS IN ADDITIONAL AREAS THAT NEED THEM," was referred to the Committee on Finance with Representatives Luke, Takai, Wakai and Wooley being excused.

Representative McKelvey, for the Committee on Economic Revitalization, Business, & Military Affairs presented two reports:

(Stand. Com. Rep. No. 981) recommending that H.R. No. 26, be adopted; and

(Stand. Com. Rep. No. 982) recommending that H.C.R. No. 24, be adopted.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the reports of the Committee be adopted, and that H.R. No. 26 and H.C.R. No. 24, be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Marumoto rose to speak in support of the measures, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in favor of these Resolutions in Stand. Com. Nos. 981 and 982. Although most of us, as legislators are familiar with the heroic exploits of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team, the 100th Battalion and other military units, many young people in Hawaii have not heard about their story. On the mainland, even fewer know the story of these brave *nissei*. So, a postage stamp would convey their history throughout the entire country to all Americans, young and old. Thank you."

Representative Ching rose to speak in support of the measures, stating:

"Yes, thank you very much. I rise in support of both of these measures. Mr. Speaker, I echo the words of the Representative from Kaimuki, but as a former educator, I cannot tell you the deep impact that when people see what their great grandfathers or grandfathers have done, how this inspires them to be the best that they can be.

"The Go For Broke members, my district has had, traditionally, many people who are, many of them, unfortunately, have now passed, but still some that are members of the 442nd, and that Go For Broke courageous attitude of seize the day. All because they wanted to show that they too were Americans. This is so inspirational. The film, *Go For Broke*, if there are those of you who have not seen the black and white film, I recommend it wholeheartedly, and I've always been a supporter of the Go For Broke.

"So, thank you very much for introducing this, the Representative of Kalihi."

Representative Karamatsu rose to speak in support of the measures, stating:

"In support. My uncle was in the 526th Artillery, attached to the 442nd Regimental Combat Team, and I also have friends, both in the 442nd and the 100th Battalion. So, I would like to also insert written comments in support of both Resolutions. Thank you very much."

Representative Karamatsu's written remarks are as follows:

"I rise in support of House Resolution 26 and House Concurrent Resolution 24, which urges the United States Postal Service to issue postal stamps honoring the World War II Japanese-American Nisei soldiers, other distinguished military units in United States history, and Americans who fought against discrimination based on race or national origin.

"I look up to the Nisei generation and how they faced discrimination. Many proved their loyalty by serving in the United States military. My uncle, Roy Okubo, served in the 522nd Artillery that was attached to the 442nd Regimental Combat Team. My political mentor, former State Senator Nadao "Najo" Yoshinaga, also served in the 442nd Regimental Combat Team. I have friends in the 100th Infantry Battalion, 442nd Regimental Combat Team, and the Military Intelligence Service. Words cannot describe my gratitude for the ultimate sacrifice they have done for future generations such as mine.

"In addition, I am inspired by the many individuals who were instrumental in enhancing race relations in the United States and who worked towards ending discrimination based on race or national origin. They too, played a key role in making our country a better place. This generation is considered by many, including me, as one of the greatest generations in the history of the United States. I am forever grateful for all they have done. It is because of them, I am inspired to continue my work

to provide equality for all and bring peace to every individual in the world."

At 12:46 o'clock p.m. the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:47 o'clock p.m.

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measures, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In support. Thank you very much. May I have the words of the Representative of Kaimuki entered in the record as if they were my own? And I just want to add a few brief comments, that this also applies to other units, and one such unit is the Tuskegee Airmen. I was very honored to meet one of the surviving members of the Tuskegee airmen at the Hilton Hawaiian Village the other day, and managed to share a few minutes with him. Their sacrifice can't be understated. So, again, in strong support. Thank you."

The motion was out to vote by the Chair and carried, and the reports of the Committee were adopted and H.R. No. 26, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE TO ISSUE POSTAL STAMPS HONORING THE WORLD WAR II JAPANESE-AMERICAN NISEI SOLDIERS, OTHER DISTINGUISHED MILITARY UNITS IN UNITED STATES HISTORY, AND AMERICAN'S WHO FOUGHT AGAINST DISCRIMINATION BASED ON RACE OR NATIONAL ORIGIN," was adopted, with Representatives Luke, Takai, Wakai and Wooley being excused; and

H.C.R. No. 24, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE TO ISSUE POSTAL STAMPS HONORING THE WORLD WAR II JAPANESE-AMERICAN NISEI SOLDIERS, OTHER DISTINGUISHED MILITARY UNITS IN UNITED STATES HISTORY, AND AMERICAN'S WHO FOUGHT AGAINST DISCRIMINATION BASED ON RACE OR NATIONAL ORIGIN," was adopted, with Representatives Luke, Takai, Wakai and Wooley being excused.

Representative McKelvey, for the Committee on Economic Revitalization, Business, & Military Affairs presented two reports:

(Stand. Com. Rep. No. 984) recommending that H.C.R. No. 19, as amended in HD 1, be adopted.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the reports of the Committee be adopted, and that H.R. No. 21, HD 1, and H.C.R. No. 19, HD 1, be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

At this time, Representative McKelvey moved to amend H.R. No. 21, HD 1, to include the words "each member of Hawaii's Congressional delegation" after the clause "the Secretary of Defense," in the "be it further resolved" clause so that it is consistent with H.C.R. No. 19, HD 1, seconded by Representative Choy.
