A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 286-240, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsections (q) and (h) to read as follows: 2 The examiner of drivers shall disqualify any person 3 from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less 4 5 than [ninety] one hundred eighty days and not more than one year 6 for a first violation, or for at least [one year] two years and not more than five years for a second violation, or at least three years and not more than five years for a third or 8 subsequent violation of a driver or vehicle out-of-service order 9 committed in a commercial motor vehicle transporting non-10 hazardous materials arising from separate incidents occurring 11 within a ten-year period. 12 The examiner of drivers shall disqualify any person 13 from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less 14 than one hundred eighty days [or] and not more than two years 15

for a first violation, or for at least three years and not more

17 than five years for any subsequent violation, of a driver or

vehicle out-of-service order committed in a commercial motor
