A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 286-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

"(b) A person operating the following category or
combination of categories of motor vehicles shall be examined as
provided in section 286-108 and duly licensed by the examiner of
drivers:

7 (1) Mopeds;

8 (2) Motorcycles and motor scooters;

(3) Passenger cars of any gross vehicle weight rating, 9 buses designed to transport fifteen or fewer 10 occupants, and trucks and vans having a gross vehicle 11 weight rating of fifteen thousand pounds or less; and 12 (4) All of the motor vehicles in category (3) and [trucks 13 having a gross vehicle weight rating of fifteen 14 thousand one through twenty six thousand pounds.] any 15 vehicle that is not a commercial motor vehicle. 16

A school bus or van operator shall be properly licensed tooperate the category of vehicles that the operator operates as a

school bus or van and shall comply with the standards of the
 department of transportation as provided by rules adopted
 pursuant to section 286-181."

4 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
