## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the staff of the
2	Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund is encountering
3	difficulties performing its duties. The legislature believes
4	that these difficulties are the result of an increased and more
5	complex workload, shortage of personnel, and absence of board
6	and administrative leadership.
7	The legislature further finds that the enabling law for the
8	voluntary employees' beneficiary association trust, an

- 9 alternative health-benefits system used by the employee
- organization for public school teachers, will sunset on July 1, 10
- The legislature declares that it does not intend to make 11
- the enabling law permanent or extend the sunset date for another 12
- pilot testing period. 13
- Notwithstanding this intent, the legislature finds that the 14
- staff of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund 15
- will experience extreme difficulty assisting in the transition 16
- of public school teachers and their dependents from the 17

- 1 employer-union health benefits trust fund on July 1, 2010, while
- 2 continuing to perform its normal duties. The legislature does
- 3 not want to place an excessive burden on the staff or cause
- 4 uncertainty for these public school teachers and their
- 5 dependents.

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- 6 Thus, the purpose of this Act is to:
  - (1) Extend the enabling law for the voluntary employees' beneficiary association trust for six months to provide for a smoother transition to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund;
    - (2) Appropriate funds for five temporary positions to assist in the transition of public employees and their dependents from the voluntary employees' beneficiary association trust to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund;
      - (3) Appropriate funds for five permanent positions to assist in the performance of Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund duties; and
      - (4) Appropriate funds to cover costs associated with the transition from the voluntary employees' beneficiary association trust to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund.

SECTION 2. Act 245, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, section 8, as amended by Act 294, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, section 3 2, as amended by Act 16, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, section 18, as amended by Act 5, First Special Session Laws of Hawaii 5 2008, section 1, is amended to read as follows: "SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval, 6 for the purpose of establishing a voluntary employees' 7 8 beneficiary association trust pilot program in March, 2006 and shall be repealed on [July 1,] December 31, 2010; provided that 10 sections 89-2, 89-3, 89-6, and 89-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 11 are reenacted in the form in which they read on the day before 12 the effective date of this Act; and provided further that the amendments made to section 89-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by Act 13 14 202, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, shall not be repealed when 15 that section is reenacted on [July 1, 2009.] December 31, 2010." 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii 17 employer-union health benefits trust fund of the State of Hawaii 18 the sum of \$232,542 or so much thereof as may be necessary for 19 fiscal year 2010-2011 for five temporary positions under the

- 6 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
- 7 employer-union health benefits trust fund of the State of Hawaii
- 8 the sum of \$244,359 or so much thereof as may be necessary for
- 9 fiscal year 2010-2011 for five permanent positions under the
- 10 Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund to assist in
- 11 the performance of duties of the trust fund.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 13 employer-union health benefits trust fund for the purposes of
- 14 this Act.
- 15 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
- 16 employer-union health benefits trust fund of the State of Hawaii
- 17 the sum of \$223,099 or so much thereof as may be necessary for
- 18 fiscal year 2010-2011 for costs associated with the transition
- 19 from the voluntary employees' beneficiary association trust to
- 20 the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 2 employer-union health benefits trust fund for the purposes of
- 3 this Act.
- 4 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2010.
