# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. This part amends sections of the Hawaii Revised
3	Statutes that are not set for repeal and reenactment by Act 58,
4	Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended.
5	SECTION 2. Section 40-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§40-2 Accounting systems and internal control; enforcing
8	the use of and inspection of the same. (a) The accounting
9	system installed by the commission on public accountancy under
10	Act 181, Session Laws of Hawaii 1923, as amended by Act 220,
11	Session Laws of Hawaii 1925, for use in the offices of the
12	comptroller, director of finance, departmental and agency
13	services of the State, and the auditors, treasurers,
14	departmental and agency services of the several counties shall
15	be the accounting and reporting systems of the State and
16	counties; provided that the University of Hawaii, until June 30,
17	[2011,] 2016, may install a different accounting system [which]

- 1 that shall be in conformity with generally accepted accounting
- 2 principles as applied to colleges and universities; and provided
- 3 further that the department of education, until June 30, 2011,
- 4 may install a different accounting system [which] that shall be
- 5 in conformity to generally accepted accounting principles. The
- 6 comptroller shall make such changes and modifications in the
- 7 accounting system as shall from time to time appear to be in the
- 8 best interest of the State and counties.
- 9 (b) The departments and agencies of the executive branch
- 10 are respectively charged with the responsibility to maintain an
- 11 adequate system of internal control and with the further
- 12 responsibility to see that the internal control system continues
- 13 to function effectively as designed. The comptroller shall make
- 14 such investigations and audits from time to time to enforce the
- 15 use of the accounting system and internal control systems in the
- 16 executive branch.
- 17 (c) The judiciary, the legislature, and each county shall
- 18 be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of its
- 19 respective internal control system."
- 20 SECTION 3. Section 40-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:

- In favor of assignees. No assignment of moneys by "≤40-58 a person to whom the State is directly indebted shall be effective unless the assignment is first approved by the 3 comptroller or, in the case of the University of Hawaii until 4 5 June 30, 2016, and the department of education [ - ] until June 30, 2011, by their respective chief financial officers. comptroller or the chief financial officers of the University of 7 Hawaii and the department of education may prescribe the form 8 for an assignment, and may approve the assignment within a reasonable time period if, in their respective discretion, the 10 rights or obligations of the State, the University of Hawaii, or 11 the department of education under any contract or other 12 undertaking or under any law, rule, or order by a competent 13 authority will not be prejudiced thereby. Upon approval of the 14 assignment, the comptroller or the respective chief financial 15 officers of the University of Hawaii and the department of 16 17 education shall draw a warrant payable to the assignee. Except as to contracts encumbered by the comptroller, the University of 18 Hawaii, or the department of education, each expending agency, 19 upon notification of the comptroller's approval of an 20 21 assignment, shall prepare a claim for payment in accordance with
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the terms of the assignment."

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SECTION 4. Section 40-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$40-81 Report by agencies receiving special moneys. 4 state officers, departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, or 5 agencies collecting or receiving any moneys not required by law 6 to be deposited in the state treasury shall report to the 7 comptroller all receipts and disbursements on account thereof 8 for each quarterly period of the calendar year not later than 9 the fifteenth day following the end of each quarterly period on 10 such forms and under such rules as may be prescribed by the 11 comptroller; provided that [until June 30, 2011,] with respect 12 to all moneys held outside the state treasury by the University 13 of Hawaii until June 30, 2016, or the department of education 14 until June 30, 2011, pursuant to the authority granted to the 15 university and the department of education by this chapter, the 16 University of Hawaii and the department of education shall 17 report to the comptroller all transactions for each quarterly

period not later than the fifteenth day following the end of

each quarterly period on such forms and under such rules as may

be prescribed by the comptroller."

2	SECTION 5. This part amends sections of the Hawaii Revised					
3	Statutes in the form in which they will read after they are					
4	repealed and reenacted under Act 58, Session Laws of Hawaii					
5	2004, as amended, on June 30, 2010.					
6	SECTION 6. Section 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
7	amended to read as follows:					
8	"§40-1 Comptroller to supervise accounts, etc. (a) The					
9	comptroller shall be the general accountant of the State $[\tau]$ and					
10	[he] shall cause to be recorded every receipt and disbursement					
11	of money made to, by, or through the treasury. [He] The					
12	comptroller shall have the power to withhold any disbursement					
13	for which no appropriation has been made or which would cause a					
14	specific appropriation to be exceeded.					
15	(b) With respect to the executive branch, [he] except the					
16	University of Hawaii until June 30, 2016, the comptroller shall					
17	have complete supervision of all accounts. [He] The comptroller					
18	shall preaudit all proposed payments to determine the propriety					
19	of expenditures and compliance with [such] executive orders[7]					
20	and rules [and regulations as] that may be in effect. [He shall

1	he shall promptly notify] approval is withheld, the department
2	or agency concerned[-] shall be promptly notified. With respec
3	to the University of Hawaii, the comptroller shall issue
4	warrants for the release of funds for the operating costs of the
5	university in amounts and at times mutually agreed upon by the
6	governor or director of finance and the university; provided
7	<u>that:</u>
8	(1) The amounts released shall not exceed the allotment
9	ceilings for the funding sources of the university's
10	appropriations established by the governor for an
11	allotment period pursuant to section 37-34; and
12	(2) The comptroller may issue warrants as an advance from
13	the state treasury to the University of Hawaii, to
14	establish a checking account and provide working
15	capital in amounts and at times mutually agreed upon
16	by the governor or director of finance and the
17	University of Hawaii.
18	The University of Hawaii shall preaudit all proposed payments of
19	\$10,000 or more to determine the propriety of expenditures and
20	compliance with applicable laws, executive orders, and rules as
21	may be in effect. The University of Hawaii shall make
22	disbursements for operating expenses from the amounts released
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by the comptroller and maintain records and documents necessary 1 2 to support those disbursements at times mutually agreed upon by the university president and the comptroller; provided that when 3 requested by the university, the comptroller shall make all 5 disbursements for the university subject to available allotment. Funds released pursuant to this section shall be deposited by 6 the university in accordance with the provisions applicable to 7 8 the director of finance by chapter 38. Any interest earned on the deposit of funds released pursuant to this section shall be 9 10 deposited in the state treasury at the end of each fiscal year. 11 With respect to the judiciary and the legislature, (c) [he] the comptroller shall make available to the judiciary and 12 the legislature the total amount appropriated to each, except 13 14 that the judiciary and the legislature may request [his] the comptroller's services in maintaining custody of the amount 15 appropriated to each and in making payments therefrom. 16 17 such services are requested, [he] the comptroller shall make all 18 disbursements requested by the judiciary or the legislature, but [he] shall not make any disbursement for which no appropriation 19 has been made or which would cause a specific appropriation to 20

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be exceeded.

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- Any financial transaction recorded [by the 1 2 comptroller] may be inspected by the public." Section 40-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3. SECTION 7. amended to read as follows: 4 "§40-4 Publication of statements. The comptroller shall 5 prepare and submit to the governor, and publish in a newspaper of general circulation in the [State, state, immediately 7 following the close of each fiscal year, a statement of income and expenditure by funds, showing the principal sources of 10 revenue, the function or purpose for which expenditures were made, together with a consolidated statement showing similar 11 information for all funds; also a statement showing the balance 12 in each fund at the beginning of the fiscal year, plus the 13 14 receipts, minus the disbursements, and the balance on hand at the close of the fiscal year after deducting outstanding **15** warrants and vouchers. The comptroller may request all 16 agencies, the judiciary, the University of Hawaii until June 30,
- 20 SECTION 8. Section 40-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 amended to read as follows:

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1	"§40-6 Approval of business and accounting forms. The
2	comptroller shall determine the forms required to adequately

7	forms for review and approval before ordering the same
8	printed[-]; except that the University of Hawaii until June 30,
9	2016, shall be subject to this requirement only with respect to
10	uniform business and accounting forms of statewide use in the
11	State's accounting system. All standard state forms shall be
12	classified, numbered, and standardized in design, dimensions,
13	color, and grade of paper and recorded in a catalogue of
14	accounting and statistical forms by the comptroller."
15	PART III
16	SECTION 9. This part amends sections of the Hawaii Revised
17	Statutes set for repeal and reenactment under Act 58, Session
18	Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended, in the event that the 2010
19	legislature either repeals the reenactment provisions of Act 58,
20	Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended, that apply to these
21	sections, or extends the date on which these sections will be

repealed and reenacted.

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- SECTION 10. Section 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 2 3 "(b) With respect to the executive branch, except the University of Hawaii until June 30, [2011,] 2016, the Hawaii 4 tourism authority, and the department of education until 5 June 30, 2011, the comptroller shall have complete supervision 6 7 of all accounts. The comptroller shall preaudit all proposed 8 payments of \$10,000 or more to determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance with executive orders and rules that 9 10 may be in effect. When necessary, the comptroller shall withhold approval of any payment. Whenever approval is 11 withheld, the department or agency concerned shall be promptly 12 notified. With respect to the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii 13 14 tourism authority, and the department of education, the 15 comptroller shall issue warrants for the release of funds for the operating costs of the university, the Hawaii tourism 16 authority, or the department of education, as applicable, in 17 amounts and at times mutually agreed upon by the governor or 18 19 director of finance and the university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of education, as applicable; 20 21 provided[+] that:
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1	(1)	The amounts released shall not exceed the allotment
2		ceilings for the respective funding sources of the
3		university's or the department of education's
4		appropriations established by the governor for an
5		allotment period pursuant to section 37-34, or in the
6		case of the Hawaii tourism authority, revenues
7		received by the convention center enterprise special
8		fund and the tourism special fund pursuant to section
9		237D-6.5; and

- the state treasury to the University of Hawaii, the
  Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of
  education to establish a checking account and provide
  working capital in amounts and at times mutually
  agreed upon by the governor or director of finance and
  the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism
  authority, and the department of education.
- The University of Hawaii shall preaudit all proposed payments of \$10,000 or more and the Hawaii tourism authority and the department of education shall preaudit all proposed payments to determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance with applicable laws, executive orders, and rules as may be in

- 1 effect. The University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority,
- 2 and the department of education shall make disbursements for
- 3 operating expenses from the amounts released by the comptroller
- 4 and maintain records and documents necessary to support those
- 5 disbursements at times mutually agreed upon by the university
- 6 president, the executive director of the Hawaii tourism
- 7 authority, or the superintendent of education, as applicable,
- 8 and the comptroller; provided that when requested by the
- 9 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
- 10 education, the comptroller shall make all disbursements for the
- 11 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
- 12 education, as applicable, subject to available allotment. Funds
- 13 released pursuant to this section shall be deposited by the
- 14 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
- 15 education, as applicable, in accordance with the provisions
- 16 applicable to the director of finance by chapter 38. Except for
- 17 moneys deposited by the Hawaii tourism authority in the
- 18 convention center enterprise special fund pursuant to section
- 19 201B-8, and in the tourism special fund pursuant to section
- 20 201B-11, any interest earned on the deposit of funds released
- 21 pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the state
- 22 treasury at the end of each fiscal year."



- 1 SECTION 11. Section 40-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$40-4 Publication of statements. The comptroller shall
- 4 prepare and submit to the governor, immediately following the
- 5 close of each fiscal year, a statement of income and expenditure
- 6 by funds, showing the principal sources of revenue, the function
- 7 or purpose for which expenditures were made, together with a
- 8 consolidated statement showing similar information for all
- 9 funds; also a statement showing the balance in each fund at the
- 10 beginning of the fiscal year, plus the receipts, minus the
- 11 disbursements, and the balance on hand at the close of the
- 12 fiscal year after deducting outstanding warrants and vouchers.
- 13 The comptroller may request all agencies, the judiciary, the
- 14 University of Hawaii until June 30, [2011,] 2016, the Hawaii
- 15 tourism authority, the department of education until June 30,
- 16 2011, and the legislature to provide such information as may be
- 17 required for the preparation of statements."
- 18 SECTION 12. Section 40-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "\$40-6 Approval of business and accounting forms. The
- 21 comptroller shall determine the forms required to adequately
- 22 supply accounting and statistical data for the state government.

- 1 The comptroller shall require heads of departments and
- 2 establishments of the state government to submit proposed new
- 3 forms or proposed changes in current business and accounting
- 4 forms for review and approval before ordering the same printed;
- 5 except that the University of Hawaii until June 30, [2011,]
- 6 2016, the Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of
- 7 education until June 30, 2011, shall be subject to this
- 8 requirement only with respect to uniform business and accounting
- 9 forms of statewide use in the State's accounting system. All
- 10 standard state forms shall be classified, numbered, and
- 11 standardized in design, dimensions, color, and grade of paper
- 12 and recorded in a catalogue of accounting and statistical forms
- 13 by the comptroller."
- 14 PART IV
- 15 SECTION 13. Any act passed by the 2010 legislature,
- 16 whether enacted before or after the effective date of this Act,
- 17 shall be amended to conform to the provisions of this Act that
- 18 change the repeal date of the University of Hawaii's authority
- 19 under sections 40-1, 40-2, 40-4, 40-6, 40-58, and 40-81, Hawaii
- 20 Revised Statutes, to June 30, 2016.
- 21 SECTION 14. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1	SECTION 15. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effec
2	retroactive to April 30, 2010; provided that:
3	(1) Part II shall only take effect upon the repeal and
4	reenactment of sections 40-1, 40-4, and 40-6, Hawaii
5	Revised Statutes, on June 30, 2010, pursuant to Act
6.	58, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended; and
7	(2) Part III shall only take effect upon the repeal of
8	paragraph (2)(B) of section 14 of Act 58, Session Law
9	of Hawaii 2004, as amended, pursuant to an Act of the
10	2010 legislature; or in the absence of that repeal,
11	upon the extension of the June 30, 2010, repeal date
12	in paragraph (2) of section 14 of Act 58, Session Law
13	of Hawaii 2004, as amended, pursuant to an Act of the
14	2010 legislature.
