A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. (a) The chair of the board of pharmacy shall
2	establish a task force to conduct a study to determine the
3	feasibility of lowering the age at which vaccinations may be
4	administered by pharmacists; assess the feasibility of requiring
5	every pharmacy and remote dispensing pharmacy to have the
6	capacity to transmit and maintain prescriptions and prescription
7	information electronically; and develop a plan for pharmacy
8	participation in the Hawaii Health Information Exchange. The
9	task force shall conduct research, assess, plan, and evaluate
10	the following:
11	(1) The potential benefits and drawbacks of lowering the
12	age restrictions for pharmacists to administer
13	vaccines to children;
14	(2) The most effective means to lower such age
15	restrictions;
16	(3) Whether additional education or certification
17	requirements for vaccinating pharmacists would be
18	necessary or recommended;

- 4 (5) The feasibility, costs, and benefits of requiring
 5 every pharmacy and remote dispensing pharmacy to have
 6 the capacity to transmit and maintain prescription and
 7 prescription records electronically and a time frame
 8 for implementing this requirement; and
- 9 (6) A plan to include pharmacy participation in the Hawaii10 Health Information Exchange.
- 11 The task force shall submit a report of its findings and
 12 recommendations, including any implementing legislation, to the
 13 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 14 the regular session of 2011.
- (b) The task force shall be situated in the department of
 health for administrative purposes and the members shall serve
 without compensation. The task force shall be chaired by the
 director of health or the director's designee and shall
 comprise:
- 20 (1) One member of the board of pharmacy;
- 21 (2) Two members of the Hawaii Pharmacists Association;

1	(3) Two pharmacists from chain store pharmacies, including
2	one pharmacist from a national chain store with
3	experience in pharmacy-administered vaccinations to
4	pediatric recipients as young as nine years of age,
5	and one pharmacist from each of two independent
6	pharmacies; provided that the participating pharmacies
7	shall be selected by the task force;
8	(4) One member of the American Academy of Pediatrics,
9	Hawaii Chapter; and
10	(5) One member from the Hawaii Health Information
11	Exchange.
12	(c) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2011.
13	SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon approval and
14	shall be repealed on July 1, 2011.
