BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 291-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending the definitions of "issuing agency" and
3	"removable windshield placard" to read:
4	""Issuing agency" means [an agency authorized by a county
5	to issue removable windshield placards, temporary removable
6	windshield placards, special license plates, and identification
7	cards pursuant to this part.] the disability and communication
8	access board.
9	"Removable windshield placard" means a two-sided, hanger-
10	style placard issued under this part to a person with a
11	disability who presents a certificate of disability that
12	verifies that the applicant's disability is expected to last for
13	at least [four] <u>six</u> years."
14	SECTION 2. Section 291-51.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§291-51.3 Reimbursement to counties[+]; agreement with
17	counties to provide permits. The State shall reimburse the

18 counties for the unit cost of [issuing] providing a removable

- 2 on behalf of the State. [Beginning July 1, 2006, the rate of
- 3 the per unit cost reimbursement shall be \$12. All fees
- 4 collected by the counties for issuing removable and temporary
- 5 removable windshield placards shall be deposited into the state
- 6 general fund.] The reimbursement rate paid to the counties for
- 7 providing removable windshield placards, temporary removable
- 8 windshield placards, special license plates, and identification
- 9 cards shall be established pursuant to section 291-56; provided
- 10 that a county may retain any fees charged for a transaction."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 291-51.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "§291-51.5 Special license plates. Upon application by a
- 14 person with a disability, [each county] the issuing agency shall
- 15 issue special license plates for the vehicle registered in the
- 16 applicant's name if the vehicle is primarily used to transport
- 17 that person. The fee for the issuance of special license plates
- 18 shall not exceed the fee charged for similar license plates for
- 19 the same class vehicle."
- 20 SECTION 4. Section 291-51.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:

"\$291-51.6 Issuance of temporary removable windshield 1 placards. [Each county] The issuing agency shall issue one 2 temporary removable windshield placard [and a second temporary 3 removable windshield placard] to each applicant who requests and 4 presents a certificate of disability that verifies the duration 5 of the applicant's disability in monthly increments, which shall 6 not exceed six months, and upon payment of a fee to the issuing 7 [All fees collected by the counties for issuing 8 agency. temporary removable windshield placards shall be deposited into 9 10 the state general fund. The temporary removable windshield 11 placard shall be designed, fabricated, and sold to the counties at a rate negotiated by the disability and communication access 12 13 board.] Upon request of an applicant who was previously issued one temporary removable windshield placard, a second temporary 14 removable windshield placard shall be issued to that applicant 15 16 upon verification of the applicant's disability." SECTION 5. - 7 SECTION 6. Section 291-52.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "\$291-52.5 Issuance of identification card. [Each] The
- 10 issuing agency shall issue one identification card at the same
- 11 time it issues a removable windshield placard, temporary
- 12 removable windshield placard, or special license plates to a
- 13 person with a disability."
- 14 SECTION 7. Section 291-52.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$291-52.6 Replacement of a [lost, stolen, or mutilated]
- 17 removable windshield placard or identification card. A
- 18 removable windshield placard, temporary removable windshield
- 19 placard, or identification card [that is reported lost, stolen,
- 20 or mutilated] shall be replaced upon:
- 21 (1) Submittal to the issuing agency of [+

. 1	(A) A written statement by a person with a disabilit
2	that the placard or identification card was
3	either lost, stolen, or mutilated; and
4	(B) A] a completed application for a removable
5	windshield placard, temporary removable
6	windshield placard, or identification card to the
7	issuing agency; and
8	(2) Payment of a fee [to the issuing agency.
9	All fees collected by the counties for replacement of a lost,
10	stolen, or mutilated removable windshield placard shall be
11	deposited into the state general fund]."
12	SECTION 8. Section 291-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	"\$291-56 Rules. The disability and communication access
15	board shall adopt rules under chapter 91 to carry out the
16	purposes of this part, including rules for:
17	(1) The issuance, renewal, confiscation, revocation, and
18	suspension of removable windshield placards, temporary
19	removable windshield placards, and special license
20	plates;
21	(2) Decertification, reciprocity, and the replacement of
22	placards and identification cards;

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1	(3) The design of the placard, identification card, and
2	special license plates;
3	(4) The establishment of transaction fees for placards;
4	(5) Signage and marking of parking spaces; [and]
5	(6) Reimbursement rates to the counties; and
6	[(6)] <u>(7)</u> Penalties."
7	SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon approval.
