A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§132D- County ordinances. (a) Nothing in this chapter
5 shall be construed to supersede or in any manner affect a county
6 fireworks ordinance; provided that the ordinance is at least as
7 stringent in the control or prohibition of fireworks as the law
8 under this chapter.

9 (b) Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit a county from
10 enacting ordinances that are more stringent in the control or
11 prohibition of fireworks than this chapter."

12 SECTION 2. Section 132D-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13 repealed.

7 SECTION 3. (a) There shall be established within the
8 legislative reference bureau for administrative purposes an
9 illegal fireworks task force. The task force shall develop a
10 plan and make recommendations to stop the importation of illegal
11 fireworks and explosives into Hawaii and develop a strategy to
12 ensure the safety and security of the airports, harbors, and
13 other facilities and institutions in this State against the
14 discharge of illegal fireworks and explosives.

15 (b) The illegal fireworks task force shall meet a minimum
16 of five times between June 1, 2010, and December 31, 2010. The
17 task force may continue to meet beyond December 31, 2010, if
18 necessary. The task force shall be dissolved on June 30, 2011.

19 (c) The legislative reference bureau shall provide
20 administrative support to the illegal fireworks task force.

21 (d) The co-chairs of the illegal fireworks task force
22 shall be the chair of the senate committee on public safety and



1 military affairs and the chair of the house committee on public
2 safety. The task force may include representatives from the
3 following organizations:

- 4 (1) Federal Bureau of Investigation;
- 5 (2) United States Drug Enforcement Agency;
- 6 (3) United States Coast Guard;
- 7 (4) Department of Homeland Security;
- 8 (5) Department of public safety;
- 9 (6) Department of transportation;
- 10 (7) Department of agriculture;
- 11 (8) Department of transportation - harbors division;
- 12 (9) Department of transportation - airports division;
- 13 (10) Department of defense;
- 14 (11) Department of the attorney general;
- 15 (12) Police departments of the city and county of Honolulu,
16 county of Maui, county of Hawaii, and county of Kauai;
- 17 (13) Office of the prosecuting attorney of the city and
18 county of Honolulu, county of Maui, county of Hawaii,
19 and county of Kauai;
- 20 (14) State fire council;
- 21 (15) Consumer Product Safety Commission;
- 22 (16) Federal Aviation Administration;



1 (17) Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and
2 Explosives; and

3 (18) United States Customs and Border Protection;


4 provided that the governor, the president of the senate, and
5 the speaker of the house of representatives shall each appoint
6 one member in addition to those specified in paragraphs (1)
7 through (18); provided further that two additional members of
8 the task force shall be representatives of the shipping and
9 trucking industries; and provided further that two additional
10 members of the task force shall be representatives of the
11 fireworks industry.

12 (e) The illegal fireworks task force shall submit a
13 preliminary plan and strategy report to the legislature no later
14 than January 10, 2011.

15 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
