A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ADDRESS THE BUDGET SHORTFALL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
- 2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 3 the Hawaii Constitution.
- 4 SECTION 2. A critical fiscal emergency exists. Many
- 5 unprecedented events have converged to create an economic,
- 6 financial, and fiscal environment that threatens the very
- 7 foundation of our national economy. Problems that arose in the
- 8 national housing sector and sub-prime mortgage market last year
- 9 have radiated from Wall Street to Main Street. Across the
- 10 United States, the result has been increasing business
- 11 bankruptcies and closures, lower consumer confidence and
- 12 spending, and job losses and rising unemployment.
- 13 For state governments, the financial crisis and economic
- 14 downturn have adversely impacted tax revenues and budgets. Most
- 15 states, like Hawaii, rely on income and sales taxes as their
- 16 main sources of revenues. The slowdown in employment and

- 1 consumer spending has reduced state revenues nationwide at a
- 2 time when operating costs continue to rise.
- 3 Hawaii is experiencing a severe contraction in its visitor,
- 4 retail, and construction industries. As a consequence, the
- 5 council on revenues has revised its revenue projections downward
- 6 five times during 2008 and once again at the beginning of
- 7 January 2009. For fiscal year 2008-2009 alone, these downward
- 8 projections result in a reduction totaling \$491,100,000. Based
- 9 on the council on revenues' January 2009 projections, the State
- 10 is faced with a general fund revenue shortfall of \$343,100,000
- 11 in fiscal year 2008-2009 if corrective action is not taken.
- 12 This emergency appropriation is necessary for the State to
- 13 address this shortfall.
- 14 SECTION 3. The legislature finds and declares that:
- 15 (1) The health care payments program (HMS 401) of the
- department of human services is essential to the
- 17 public health, safety, and welfare of the people of
- 18 the State of Hawaii;
- 19 (2) An appropriation from the emergency and budget reserve
- fund is needed to fund the health care payments
- 21 program for fiscal year 2008-2009 due to the severe

1		economic downturn impacting the State that has reduced
2		state general fund revenues;
3	(3)	The appropriation in this Act will assist in
4		addressing the critical budget shortfall facing the
5		State in fiscal year 2008-2009 by allowing moneys from
6		the emergency and budget reserve fund to be used as a
7		source of funding to replace the general funds that
8		are currently appropriated for the health care
9		payments program for fiscal year 2008-2009; and
10	(4)	The appropriation in this Act is consistent with the
11	ä	purposes of the emergency and budget reserve fund.
12	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate \$60,000,000 from	
13	the emergency and budget reserve fund to replace general funds	
14	appropriated in Act 213, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, as amended	
15	by Act 158, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, for the health care	
16	payments program (HMS 401) of the department of human services	
17	and, thereby, help to address the budget shortfall in fiscal	
18	year 2008-2009.	
19	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the emergency and	
20	budget reserve fund the sum of \$60,000,000 or so much thereof as	
21	may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the health care	
22	payments program (HMS 401). The funds are to be used to replace

- 1 a like amount of general funds currently appropriated for the
- 2 health care payments program.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Description:

Emergency appropriation from the Emergency and Budget Reserve Fund to replace general funds appropriated for the health care payments program (HMS 401) to address the budget shortfall in fiscal year 2008-2009. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB1064 HD1)
