<u>H.B. NO. 1132</u>

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 134-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows: 2 "(C) 3 This section shall not apply to law enforcement 4 officers of county police [and sheriff] departments of this State, law enforcement officers of the department of public 5 safety, and conservation and resources enforcement officers of 6 the department of land and natural resources, or vendors 7 providing electric guns to those entities; provided that 8 electric guns shall at all times remain in the custody and 9 control of the law enforcement officers of the county police [or 10 sheriff] departments[-], the law enforcement officers of the 11 12 department of public safety, or the conservation and resources enforcement officers of the department of land and natural 13 14 resources.

(d) The county police [and sheriff] departments of this
State, the department of public safety, and the department of
land and natural resources shall maintain records regarding
every electric gun in their custody and control. [Such] The

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records shall report every instance of usage of the electric 1 guns; in particular, records shall be maintained in a similar 2 manner as for those of discharging of firearms. The county 3 police [and sheriff] departments, the department of public 4 safety, and the department of land and natural resources shall 5 annually report to the legislature regarding these records 6 twenty days before the beginning of each session." 7 8 SECTION 2. The department of land and natural resources and the department of public safety shall ensure that each of their 9 10 respective law enforcement officers who are authorized to use an electric gun and related equipment shall first receive training 11 from the manufacturer or a manufacturer approved training 12 program and by manufacturer certified or approved instructors in 13 the use of electric guns prior to deployment of the electric 14 guns and related equipment in public. 15 In addition, the conservation and resources SECTION 3. 16

17 enforcement program of the department of land and natural 18 resources shall pursue law enforcement accreditation or 19 recognition from a nationally recognized law enforcement 20 accreditation or credentialing program in the use of electric 21 guns prior to purchasing electric guns and related equipment and 6

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obtaining training for the use of the electric guns by their law 1 enforcement officers. 2

3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 4



DEPARTMENT: Land and Natural Resources

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS.

PURPOSE: To authorize law enforcement officers of the Department of Public Safety and conservation and resources enforcement officers of the Department to use electric guns and related equipment while performing their duties.


MEANS: Amend section 134-16(c) and (d), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: Electric guns provide a viable alternative to the need for escalating to the use of deadly force when dealing with a combative suspect or multiple combative suspects. Electric guns deployment reduces risk and injury to both law enforcement officers and suspects alike. Electric guns have proven to be a useful tool for law enforcement throughout the United States, including Hawaii.

> The departments also acknowledge the need to provide adequate training for their officers and establish internal policies governing the use of electric guns and related equipment. Both departments are committed to ensuring that law enforcement officers authorized use of a electric guns are properly trained before moving forward with electric gun deployment.

> This bill would provide a less-than-lethal means to assist law enforcement officers in the performance of their duties to help them successfully and safely protect the citizens of Hawaii and our natural resources.

> Impact on the public: Provides a less-thanlethal means to assist law enforcement officers to safely protect the citizens of Hawaii and our natural resources.



Impact on the department and other agencies: Authorizing the use of electric guns enables the law enforcement officers to perform their jobs while utilizing safe and nonlethal alternatives to conventional guns when confronted with hostile and combative suspects or perpetrators.
