A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that affordable housing
 in the State continues to be a problem for many Hawaii
 residents. The legislature further finds that currently there
- 4 is insufficient support for low-income families and affordable
- 5 housing.
- 6 The legislature believes that a very effective means to
- 7 provide for affordable housing is to require housing developer
- 8 petitioners requesting a reclassification of district boundaries
- 9 to dedicate a certain percentage of their housing projects to
- 10 affordable housing.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to require housing developer
- 12 petitioners for reclassification of district boundaries who
- 13 develop more than twenty five housing units to dedicate sixty
- 14 per cent of their housing project to lower and gap group income
- 15 buyers.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 205-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:

8		appl	icable priority guidelines of the Hawaii state			
9		plan	and the adopted functional plans;			
10	(2)	The	extent to which the proposed reclassification			
11		conf	orms to the applicable district standards;			
12	(3)	The	impact of the proposed reclassification on the			
13		foll	owing areas of state concern:			
14		(A)	Preservation or maintenance of important natural			
15			systems or habitats;			
16		(B)	Maintenance of valued cultural, historical, or			
17			natural resources;			
18		(C)	Maintenance of other natural resources relevant			
19			to Hawaii's economy, including agricultural			
20			resources;			
21		(D)	Commitment of state funds and resources;			

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1		(E)	Provision for employment opportunities and
2			economic development; and
3		(F)	Provision for housing opportunities, including
4			rental housing, for all income groups,
5			particularly the low, low-moderate, and gap
6			groups; provided that the commission shall
7			require that sixty per cent of all proposed
8			housing units be dedicated and sold or rented to
9			low, low-moderate, or gap groups persons and
10			families, of which twenty-five per cent shall be
11			sold or rented to households with incomes up to
12			eighty per cent of the area median income as
13			determined by the United States Department of
14			Housing and Urban Development for:
15			(i) Any petition for reclassification of
16			district boundaries; and
17			(ii) Any development of twenty-five or more
18			housing units;
19	(4)	The	standards and criteria for the reclassification or
20		rezo	ning of important agricultural lands in section
21		205-	50;

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1	(5)	The county general plan and all community,
2		development, or community development plans adopted
3		pursuant to the county general plan, as they relate t
4		the land that is the subject of the reclassification
5		petition; and
6	(6)	The representations and commitments made by the
7		petitioner in securing a boundary change."
8	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Requires petitioners for reclassification of district boundaries and developers of 25 or more housing units provide for at least 60% of the units to be affordable housing, of which 25% going to the households earning up to 80% of the area median income.
