# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that medicaid is the 2 cornerstone of health care for the most needy in our population. 3 Furthermore, the legislature has previously recognized that it 4 is in the public interest to ensure that health care payments 5 made with State funds or controlled by the State are sufficient to cover the actual costs of care. However, inadequate payment 6 7 and reimbursement from medicaid have compromised access to 8 medical care not only for the uninsured and those covered by 9 medicaid but also for individuals who are covered by private 10 employer-based health insurance.

As documented in numerous media reports, the inadequacy of medical care services, especially in specialty-care coverage in rural areas and on the neighbor islands, has reached crisis proportions.

Hawaii's physicians serving medicaid-eligible persons have been adversely affected by the inadequacy of medicaid reimbursements and payments.

1 The purpose of this Act is to increase the payment for 2 physician services for medicaid-eligible persons, including fee-3 for-service and QUEST-eligible individuals, and the QUEST 4 expanded care program. 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the 8 same sum or so much thereof that may be necessary for fiscal 9 year 2010-2011 to increase payments for physician services for 10 the care of medicaid-eligible persons, including fee-for-11 service, QUEST physician services, and the QUEST expanded care 12 program.

13 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 14 of human services for the purposes of this Act; provided that: 15 The sums are equitably distributed between medicaid (1)16 fee-for-service physician services and health plans 17 that provide QUEST physician services, including the 18 QUEST expanded care program, so that the health plans 19 can increase the payment for these physician services; 20 and

1 event exceed per cent of the current medicare fee 2 schedule applicable to Hawaii. 3 SECTION 3. The department of human services shall include 4 in its supplemental budget request for fiscal year 2010-2011 a 5 sum at least equal to the sum appropriated in section 2, in 6 addition to its baseline medicaid request, that will allow for 7 increased moneys to be paid out for physician services for 8 medicaid eligible persons, including fee-for-service and QUEST 9 physician services, including the QUEST expanded access 10 program. The department shall report the amount of the baseline 11 medicaid sum and the additional funds to be paid out for 12 physician services to the legislature no later than twenty days 13 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2010. 14 SECTION 4. Report Title: Medicaid Fee Schedule Rate Increase

#### Description:

Appropriates unspecified funds for each year of the 2009-2011 fiscal biennium to increase the payments for physician services to medicaid-eligible persons, including fee-for-service, QUEST provider services, and QUEST Expanded Access Program up to an unspecified per cent of the current medicare rate. Requires the department of human services (DHS) to report to the legislature prior to the 2010 regular session with (1) the amount of baseline medicaid and additional funds needed for fiscal year 2010-2011, and (2) the amount of funding required to continue increased payments for physician services to medicaid-eligible persons. Requires DHS to seek an appropriation in an amount equal to at least the amount appropriated in 2009-2010 for additional payments for physician services. Effective date 7/1/2050. (SD1)
