12		or who is within a correctional facility;
13	(d)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
14		injury to another with a dangerous instrument;
15	(e)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
16		injury to an educational worker who is engaged in the
17		performance of duty or who is within an educational
18		facility. For the purposes of this paragraph,

1 "educational worker" means: any administrator, 2 specialist, counselor, teacher, or employee of the 3 department of education or an employee of a charter school; a person who is a volunteer, as defined in 4 5 section 90-1, in a school program, activity, or function that is established, sanctioned, or approved 6 7 by the department of education; or a person hired by 8 the department of education on a contractual basis and 9 engaged in carrying out an educational function; 10 (f) The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily 11 injury to any emergency medical services personnel who 12 is engaged in the performance of duty.
