BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 twenty per cent did not get care for a serious problem 2 requiring treatment in the past year. 3 The significant number of uninsured residents has a 4 considerable economic impact on the State's hospitals, community 5 health centers, and other health care providers, threatening the 6 effectiveness of these providers to serve the whole community. 7 The legislature finds that it is in the best interests of 8 the state to ensure access to primary and preventative health 9 care for its residents. In addition to facilitating a healthier 10 population, state expenditures attributable to hospital and 11 emergency room services for preventable injuries or illnesses 12 would be reduced. 13 The legislature further finds that the most effective means 14 to encourage access to primary health care for residents without health insurance is through Hawaii's system of federally 15 16 qualified health centers, which: 17 Are nonprofit, community-based organizations whose (1)18 purpose and expertise lie in serving people who 19 otherwise have limited or no access to health care; 20 Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate (2) 21 health care and a broad range of primary care and preventative services; 22 HB1373 SD1.DOC

2		people have limited access to other health care

8		healthier patients and decreased use of emergency,
