A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state historic 2 preservation officer requires extensive training and 3 professional experience as the administrator of the state 4 historic preservation program. The duties of the state historic 5 preservation officer include reviewing nominations for the National Register of Historic Places and maintaining data on 6 historic places in Hawaii that have yet to be nominated. 7 The 8 officer also serves as the State's consultant to federal 9 agencies during reviews of the federal Advisory Council of 10 Historic Preservation's regulations for the protection of 11 historic places and during identification and assessment of 12 historic properties.

Due to the important role of the state historic
preservation officer, the legislature originally required the
person to be appointed to the position on the basis of
professional competence and experience in the field of historic
preservation. The legislature further finds, however, that past
and present governors of the State have appointed state historic
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1 preservation officers based on broadly worded qualifications 2 that do not meet nationally accepted professional standards for 3 such a position. Requiring that the individual appointed 4 possesses the specified qualifications would bring 5 accountability and consistency to the position of state historic 6 preservation officer. 7 The purpose of this Act is to require the governor to 8 appoint a person as state historic preservation officer who 9 fulfills the profession qualification standards established by 10 the United States Secretary of the Interior. 11 SECTION 2. Section 6E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: "[+]§6E-5[+] State historic preservation officer. (a) 13 14 The governor shall appoint a state historic preservation 15 officer, and may appoint the officer without regard to chapter 76, who shall be responsible for the comprehensive historic 16 preservation program and who shall be the state liaison officer 17 18 for the conduct of relations with the federal government and the 19 respective states with regard to matters of historic 20 preservation.



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1	(b)	The state historic preservation officer shall [be
2	appointed	on the basis of professional competence and experience
3	in the field of historic preservation and]:	
4	(1)	Be a qualified historic preservation professional in
5		architecture, architectural history, archaeology,
6		history, culture, or a closely related field, who
7		meets the professional qualification standards
8		established by the United States Secretary of the
9		Interior; and
10	(2)	Have professional experience with respect to historic
11		preservation in Hawaii.
12	(c)	The state historic preservation officer shall be
13	placed in	the department for the purposes of the state program.
14	(d)	Upon appointment of the state historic preservation
15	officer by the governor, the governor shall immediately advise	
16	the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of	
17	representatives of the identity of the person appointed and the	
18	person's qualifications to serve in that position."	
19	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	



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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
