Report Title:

Advertising; Mobile Billboards; Prohibition

Description:

Amends the restrictions on the use of mobile billboards. Exempts businesses using vehicles with advertising in the daily function of the advertised business. Clarifies what constitutes certain exempted vehicles. Effective 7/1/2075. (SD2)

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOBILE BILLBOARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to close a loophole 2 that allows persons to place banners and other advertising 3 devices for others on their vehicles or trailers for 4 compensation, as long as the vehicles or trailers are not used 5 primarily to display advertising. This Act does not prohibit 6 vehicles from displaying advertising, provided that the vehicle is regularly used in the operations of the business to which the 7 8 advertising relates. The State has a substantial interest in 9 traffic safety and aesthetics, and fulfilling the responsibility 10 in article XI, section 1, of the Hawaii Constitution, which 11 states, "For the benefit of present and future generations, the 12 State and its political subdivisions shall conserve and protect 13 Hawaii's natural beauty and all natural resources" 14 SECTION 2. Section 445-112.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended as follows:

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1. By amending its title and subsection (a) to read:

15		operations of a business; provided that day-to-day
16		operations include advertising that is directly
17		limited to and directly related to an engaged
18		passenger vehicle's service route or contracted
19		customer service business, including scheduled special
20		events and parades; and
21	(2)	Carries or displays an advertising device that relates
22		only to that business."
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1	2. By amending subsection (d) to read:		
2	"(d) As used in this section:		
3	"Advertising device" means any sign, writing, picture,		
4	poster, painting, notice, bill, model, display, symbol, emblem,		
5	or similar device, which is so designed that it draws the		
6	attention of persons in any public street, roadway, or other		
7	public place.		
8	"Economic benefit" shall not include a benefit such as		
9	increased business or commercial name recognition derived by the		
10	owner of the vehicle or trailer from an advertising device that		
11	advertises the business in whose daily function the vehicle or		
12	trailer is actively used or meets the requirements of subsection		
13	<u>(a)(1).</u>		
14	"Trailer" means a vehicle or conveyance with or without		
15	motive power designed to be pulled or propelled by a vehicle or		
16	other form of power.		
17	["Vehicular advertising" means any sign, writing, picture,		
18	poster, painting, notice, bill, model, display, symbol, emblem,		
19	or similar device, which is so designed that it draws the		
20	attention of persons in any public street, roadway, or other		
21	public place.]"		

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1	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
2	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
3	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2075.
