BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending the definition of "exceptional children" to
read as follows:

4 ""Exceptional children" includes:

Persons under twenty years of age who deviate from the 5 (1)so-called normal person in physical, mental, social, 6 or emotional characteristics or abilities to such an 7 extent that specialized training, techniques, and 8 9 equipment are required to enable these persons to 10 attain the maximum of their abilities or capacities; [provided that "exceptional children" shall not 11 12 include "gifted and talented children";] 13 (2)Persons under twenty years of age who by reason of 14 physical defects cannot attend the regular public 15 school classes with normal children; [and] 16 Persons under twenty years of age who are certified by (3)17 a licensed physician eligible for membership in the state medical society as being emotionally maladjusted 18 HB LRB 09-1508.doc

1 or intellectually incapable of profiting from ordinary 2 instructional methods [-]; and 3 (4) Gifted and talented children." SECTION 2. Section 302A-444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended to read as follows: 6 "[+] §302A-444[+] Programs for gifted and talented 7 children. The department [may] shall provide a statewide 8 flexible system of educational placement and programs within the 9 public school system that the department determines is 10 appropriate for meeting the unique educational needs of gifted 11 and talented children. The nature and scope of the department's 12 educational placement and programs shall be based on, but not be 13 limited to, the following factors: The availability of financial and physical resources 14 (1)15 within the department; The nature of the child's gift or talent; and 16 (2)17 Whether the child's educational placement and program (3) 18 should focus on, or be limited to, a particular area of gift or talent, or whether the educational 19 20 placement and program should address other areas that 21 may be beneficial to the development of the child as a 22 whole."
