A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROPERLY INFLATED TIRES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that decreasing the use 2 of fossil fuel in Hawaii is of critical importance to the long-3 term sustainability of the State's environmental and economic 4 health. While efforts to speed the introduction of alternative 5 fuel vehicles and electric vehicles are needed, some simple steps can be taken to increase the fuel efficiency of vehicles 6 on Hawaii's roadways today. Some studies suggest that simply 7 maintaining the manufacturer's recommended tire inflation 8 9 pressure for a vehicle's tires can increase that vehicle's fuel 10 efficiency by upwards of five per cent. If all of the more than 1.2 million registered vehicles in Hawaii were to maintain 11 proper tire inflation pressure, the State could decrease fossil 12 fuel consumption by potentially hundreds of thousands of barrels 13 14 of oil.

15 The legislature further finds that while many retail gas 16 service stations provide tire inflation pumps or devices as a 17 courtesy to customers, some do not. Further, many of the tire 18 inflation devices that are available are either broken, require HB LRB 09-1707.doc

1	money to operate, or lack working tire gauges that enable the
2	user to determine when a tire is properly inflated. These
3	situations deter vehicle operators from properly maintaining the
4	recommended tire inflation pressures for their tires.
5	The purpose of this Act is to spur an increase in
6	efficiency of Hawaii's motor vehicles by requiring retail
7	service stations to provide free tire pressure gauges and
8	working tire inflation devices to enable motorists to maintain
9	properly inflated tires.
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 486H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12	and to read as follows:
