A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Kailua beach is that 2 part of the east shoreline of the island of Oahu between Kawainui canal to the north and Alala point to the south, in the 3 4 Koolaupoko district. Kailua beach is subject to erosion related 5 to sand deficiencies at Kailua beach park, as well as future 6 impacts related to sea-level rise. Specifically, the southern 7 end of Kailua beach is subject to long-term erosion, which is 8 migrating northward with time.

The University of Hawaii, school of ocean and earth science 9 and technology, sea grant college program, has recently started 10 11 a study on Kailua beach designed to produce place-based management recommendations for ensuring the conservation of 12 Kailua beach during the twenty-first century. The study is to 13 14 account for sea-level rise, erosion trends, and community development patterns along the beach. The goal of the study is 15 16 to define new and better management strategies for Kailua and to serve as a template for place-based management on other beaches 17 While the study is innovative, it is underfunded, 18 in Hawaii.

3 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
4 University of Hawaii to augment the sea grant college program
5 study to examine the causes and extent of erosion at Kailua
6 beach, and provide viable management strategies.

7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much 8 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the 10 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2010-2011 for the University of Hawaii, school of ocean and 11 12 earth science and technology, sea grant college program, to 13 conduct a two-year study on terminating, mitigating, and reversing beach erosion at Kailua beach; provided that the 14 15 school shall consult with federal, state, and county agencies as 16 necessary.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University18 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 3. The University of Hawaii, school of ocean and 20 earth science and technology, sea grant college program, shall 21 submit an interim report to the legislature, the governor, and 22 the mayor of the city and county of Honolulu not later than



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twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
 2010. The report shall include but not be limited to a
 discussion of short-term measures that may be adopted to reduce
 and mitigate beach erosion at Kailua beach.

5 SECTION 4. The University of Hawaii, school of ocean and 6 earth science and technology, sea grant college program, shall 7 submit a final report, including recommendations and any 8 necessary proposed legislation, to the legislature, the 9 governor, and the mayor of the city and county of Honolulu not 10 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular 11 session of 2011. The report shall include but not be limited to a discussion of short-term and long-term measures that may be 12 13 adopted to reduce, mitigate, and reverse beach erosion at Kailua 14 beach.

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
