A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL TREATMENT.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to ensure that			
2	consumers have basic information about medical treatment			
3	providers in order to make informed health care decisions. Many			
4	states have adopted laws providing consumers with physician			
5	profiles, including Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia,			
6	Illinois, Maine, New York, North Caroline, South Carolina,			
7	Maryland, and Rhode Island. Hawaii lags behind states in			
8	adopting transparency laws to assist consumers in selecting			
9	medical service providers. This Act shall be cited as the			
10	"Patient's Right to Know Act".			
11	The State of Hawaii licenses over seven thousand four			
12	hundred physicians who are required to renew their licenses			
13	every two years. Yet, consumers have little access to			
14	information about physicians. More critically, consumers have			
15	difficulty accessing information about complaints and			
16	disciplinary actions taken against physicians. While the Hawaii			
17	medical board collects certain types of information about			
18	physicians, that information is not made publicly available to			

1	consumers. This Act will require the public disclosure of
2	collected information.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
5	designated and to read as follows:
6	"§453- Physician profiles. (a) The board shall make
7	available to the public a profile of each physician licensed to
8	practice medicine in the State through an internet website and,
9	if requested, in writing. The physician profile shall contain
10	the following information:
11	(1) The full name of the physician, address and telephone
12	number of primary practice office, and electronic mail
13	address;
14	(2) A description of any criminal convictions for felonies
15	and serious misdemeanors, as determined by the board,
16	including convictions reported to the board pursuant
17	to section 329-44;
18	(3) A description of any final disciplinary action by the
19	board against the physician, including fines,
20	penalties, probation, suspension, or revocation of
21	license;

1	(4)	A description of any final disciplinary action taken
2		by any other licensing jurisdiction in other states
3		against the physician within the last five years;
4	(5)	A description of revocation or involuntary restriction
5		of hospital privileges for reasons related to
6		competence, character, or substance abuse that have
7		been taken by the hospital's governing board or
8		administrative officer, or resignation from or
9		nonrenewal of medical staff membership or restriction
10		of privileges at a hospital taken in lieu of or in
11		settlement of a pending disciplinary action. Adverse
12		decisions reported to the board pursuant to section
13		663-1.7 shall be included in the profile;
14	(6)	All medical malpractice court judgments or awards in
15		which a payment was awarded to a complainant,
16		including those reported to the board pursuant to
17		sections 453-8.7, 671-5, and 671-15;
18	(7)	Name of medical school attended, dates of attendance,
19		and date of graduation;
20	(8)	Name of graduate medical education program, dates of
21		attendance, and date of completion;

1	(9)	Specialty board certification. The toll free number
2		of the American Board of Medical Specialties shall be
3		included to verify current board certification status;
4	(10)	State or jurisdiction in which the physician is
5		licensed, date of licensure, and current status of
6		licensure;
7	(11)	Names of hospitals where the physician has privileges;
8	(12)	Status of compliance with continuing education
9		requirements;
10	(13)	Name of the professional liability insurance carrier
11		or self-insured and status of compliance with
12		financial responsibility provisions; and
13	(14)	Indication of whether the physician participates in
14		the medicaid program, health plans, or accepts
15		workers' compensation cases.
16	(b)	The board shall provide a copy of the profile to the
17	physician	prior to initial publication and the physician shall
18	have sixt	y days after receipt to correct inaccurate factual
19	information	on. The physician may elect to include the following
20	information	on: professional and community memberships, community
21	activities	s, publications in peer reviewed medical literature,

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    appointments to medical school faculty, language access, and any

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         (c) The physician shall update information in the profile
    within thirty days of any change in the information by reporting

    the change to the board.
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         (d) The board may take disciplinary action, including
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    assessing a fine or penalty, against the physician for failure
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    to comply with this section.
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              The board may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
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    necessary to carry out the purposes of this section."
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         SECTION 3. Section 453-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
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         "(b) Reports of adverse decisions of peer review
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    committees transmitted to the department under section 663-1.7
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    shall not be available to public inspection or subject to
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    discovery and shall be held confidential by the department;
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    provided that:
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         (1) A written affirmative or negative reply may be given
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              to a written inquiry by a hospital or health care
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              facility as to whether a report of an adverse decision
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              is on file with the department; [and]
