H.B. NO. 1543

A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that Kailua beach on the SECTION 1. 2 island of Oahu is a unique asset of the State that is the product of a decades-long natural process of accretion. For the 3 4 past several decades, the beachfront of Kailua beach has increased to the benefit of beach users from around the State 5 6 and the nation. Kailua beach is special within the State, as one of only a few beaches that is fully urban, accreting, and 7 8 entirely unarmored. However, this asset remains subject to 9 erosion related to sand deficiencies at Kailua beach park, as 10 well as future impacts related to sea-level rise. Because the 11 southern end of Kailua beach is now subject to long-term 12 erosion, which is migrating northward with time, it is 13 imperative to conserve and protect the legacy of Kailua beach by 14 minimizing current and future impacts of shoreline erosion. 15 SECTION 2. There is established in the University of 16 Hawaii school of ocean and earth science and technology for 17 administrative purposes the Kailua beach erosion task force. 18 The task force shall be composed of six members as follows: HB LRB 09-1744.doc

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1	(1)	One member who shall represent the United States Army
2		Corps of Engineers and who shall be appointed by the
3		dean of the University of Hawaii school of ocean and
4		earth science and technology;
5	(2)	The mayor of the city and county of Honolulu or the
6		mayor's designee;
7	(3)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
8		resources or the chairperson's designee;
9	(4)	The director of health or the director's designee;
10	(5)	One member who shall represent the United States
11		Geological Survey who shall be requested to serve, and
12		who shall be appointed by the dean of the University
13		of Hawaii school of ocean and earth science and
14		technology; and
15	(6)	The dean of the University of Hawaii school of ocean
16		and earth science and technology or the dean's
17		designee.
18	The c	dean of the University of Hawaii school of ocean and
19	earth scie	ence and technology shall serve as the chairperson of

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agenda for their meetings. The University of Hawaii school of
ocean and earth science and technology shall provide technical
support to the task force.

4 SECTION 3. The task force shall meet periodically over a 5 two year period to discuss and recommend strategies to prevent, 6 mitigate, and reverse beach erosion at Kailua beach, which shall 7 be deemed to refer to that part of the east shoreline of the 8 island of Oahu between Kawainui canal to the north and Alala 9 point to the south, in the Koolaupoko district.

10 SECTION 4. The task force shall submit an interim report 11 to the legislature, the governor, and the mayor of the city and 12 county of Honolulu not later than twenty days prior to the 13 convening of the Regular Session of 2010. The report shall 14 include but not be limited to a discussion of short-term measures that may be adopted in order to reduce and mitigate 15 16 beach erosion at Kailua beach, including a recommendation to the 17 department of land and natural resources to place a shoreline 18 set back for the immediate protection of the public.

19 SECTION 5. The task force shall submit a final report to 20 the legislature, the governor, and the mayor of the city and 21 county of Honolulu not later than twenty days prior to the 22 convening of the Regular Session of 2011. The report shall





include but not be limited to a discussion of and
recommendations for short-term and long-term measures that may
be adopted in order to reduce, mitigate, and reverse beach
erosion at Kailua beach.

5 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$25,000 or so much 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 9 2010-2011 for the study of beach erosion at Kailua beach.

10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University 11 of Hawaii school of ocean and earth science and technology for 12 the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 7. This Act shall be effective upon approval14 provided that section 5 shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
