A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE II, SECTION 1, OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION, TO DELETE THE ONE-YEAR RESIDENCY AND VOTER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT FOR VOTING AND TO FORTIFY THE RIGHT TO VOTE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the citizens of the
- 2 State of Hawaii do not have a constitutional right to vote. The
- 3 Constitution of the State of Hawaii allows a citizen to vote if
- 4 the person is a "voter registered as provided by law" and has
- 5 been a "resident of this State not less than one year next
- 6 preceding the election." In Hawaii and other states and on the
- 7 federal level, voting is a privilege granted to citizens at the
- 8 discretion of the government through the enactment of laws.
- 9 The legislature further finds that citizens have an
- 10 inherent right to vote as part of their responsibility as
- 11 citizens of the State, and that this right should not be
- 12 hindered without just cause. The right to vote is necessary to
- 13 effectuate the rule of one person, one vote, and to enable
- 14 citizens to govern through the representative form of
- 15 government. The legislature, therefore, believes that a
- 16 constitutional right to vote should be established, that

- 1 barriers to the exercise of this rights should be removed, and
- 2 that government should encourage citizens to exercise this
- 3 right.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to propose a constitutional
- 5 amendment to provide for the right to vote for citizens of the
- 6 State by repealing the one-year residency and voter registration
- 7 requirement for voting.
- 8 SECTION 2. Article 2, section 1, of the Constitution of
- 9 the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:
- 10 "ARTICLE II
- 11 SUFFRAGE AND ELECTIONS QUALIFICATIONS
- 12 Section 1. Every citizen of the United States who shall
- 13 have attained the age of eighteen years[, have been] and is a
- 14 resident of this State [not less than one year next preceding
- 15 the election and be a voter registered as provided by law],
- 16 shall be qualified to vote in any state or local election. This
- 17 right shall not be denied or abridged by the State of Hawaii or
- 18 any county, except insofar as to safeguard the integrity of
- 19 elections as provided by law."
- 20 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
- 21 be as follows:

- 2 the age of eighteen years have a constitutional right to
- 3 vote?"
- 4 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
- 5 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
- 6 underscored.
- 7 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
- 8 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of

9 the State of Hawaii.
