A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that cellular phone use 2 while driving impairs a driver's ability to react to driving 3 situations as much as consuming alcohol. Part of this 4 impairment is due to the need to look at the cellular phone 5 while dialing out a number. 6 The legislature also finds that drivers have also taken to 7 using their cellular phones and other electronic wireless communications devices, such as Blackberrys, to engage in other 8 9 activities while driving, such as text messaging, corresponding 10 by e-mail, or playing video games. These activities, although 11 harmless while sitting at a desk or in the comfort of one's own 12 home, represent a potentially fatal risk to other drivers and 13 pedestrians as exemplified by a recent train wreck on the 14 mainland caused by inattention due to texting while driving. 15 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the use of cellular phones and electronic wireless communications devices while 16 17 operating a vehicle, with certain exceptions, and to 18 specifically prohibit activities such as texting, instant

2	off the road and the hands off of the steering wheel, while

4	SECTION 2 Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
6	and to read as follows	
7	"S291C-A Mobile telephone use and electronic wireless	
8	communications device use prohibited. (a) No person shall use	
9	a mobile telephone while operating a moving motor vehicle in the	
10	State unless the mobile telephone is equipped with a hands-free	
11	accessory	
12	(b) No person shall use a mobile telephone, including	
13	those with hands-free accessories while operating a moving	
14	school bus that is carrying passengers	
15	(c) No person shall use an electronic wireless	
16	communications device, other than a voice-activated global	
17	positioning or navigation system, while operating a motor	
18	vehicle in the State	
19	(d) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the	
20	following	
21	(1) Emergency use of a mobile telephone or electronic	
22	wireless communications device, including calls	



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1		to 911, a hospital, an ambulance service	
2		provider, a fire department, or a law enforcement	
3		agency;	
4	(2)	Use of a mobile telephone or electronic wireless	
5		communications device by law enforcement or	
6		emergency personnel or by a driver of an	
7		authorized emergency vehicle, acting within the	
8		scope of official duties; or	
9	(3)	Initiating or terminating a telephone call, or	
10		turning the telephone or electronic wireless	
11		communications device on or off.	
12	(e) Viol	ation of this section shall be a violation, and	
13	courts shall impose a fine of not more than \$100 for each		
14	violation.		
15	For purposes of this section:		
16	"Electronic wireless communications device" means any		
17	device that provides to users the ability to send or receive		
18	electronic communications, but excluding a voice-activated		
19	global positioning or navigation system that is affixed to the		
20	vehicle.		
21	"Hands-fr	ee accessory" means an attachment, add-on, built-	
22	in feature, or	addition to a mobile telephone, whether or not	
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1	permanently installed in a motor vehicle, that when used, allows
2	the vehicle operator to maintain both hands on the steering
3	wheel.
4	"Mobile telephone" means a cellular, analog, wireless, or
5	digital telephone capable of sending or receiving telephone
6	messages without an access line for service.
7	"Use" means talking, placing, or receiving a call, or
8	attempting to place or receive a call, or sending, reading, or
9	writing a text message, instant message, or electronic mail, or
10	playing a video game on an electronic wireless communication
11	device or a mobile telephone.
12	"Video game" means any game that may be played by use of a
13	mobile telephone or electronic wireless communications device."
14	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Cellular phones; prohibit texting, gaming, non-hands free use

Description:

Prohibits the use of mobile telephones without hands free accessories while operating a motor vehicle. Prohibits the use of electronic wireless communication devices while operating a motor vehicle. Prohibits text messaging, gaming, and e-mailing while operating a motor vehicle. Sets forth exemptions.
