A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII'S ECONOMY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. If Hawaii is to be a player in a global 2 economy, it is essential that an assessment of the State's 3 economic conditions and prospects be assessed in an objective 4 manner to address serious challenges facing the State, including 5 the overall high cost of living and doing business in the state, 6 the high costs of housing and consumables, outward migration of 7 skilled and knowledgeable workers, and outward investment. In view of the heightened competiveness facing individual 8 states and countries, it is critical that the State's leaders 9 10 have a clear understanding of the global forces that influence the State's economy, the State's relative competitiveness, and 11 policies and options that are available for placing the State on 12 13 an optimal development path. The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to 14 allow the department of business, economic development, and 15 tourism to contract with an out-of-state contractor to undertake 16 17 a diagnostic assessment of the conditions, challenges, and 18 opportunities facing the State.

14			and new technological developments; and	
15		(D)	An initial analysis of the key policies that are	
16			affecting the State's economic global position;

18	(2)	An c	verall strategy for addressing the challenges	
19		facing the State and using the advantages and		
20	strengths of the State in meeting these challenges.			
21	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
22	revenues	of th	e State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much	
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- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for
- 2 contracting the services of economic consultants with expertise
- 3 in international and local economic analysis to undertake the
- 4 diagnostic assessment set forth in section 2. To ensure the
- 5 objectivity of the analysis, the principal consultant selected
- 6 shall be an out-of-state economic consultant.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 9 this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. Not less than twenty days prior to the
- 11 convening of the regular session of 2011, the department of
- 12 business, economic development, and tourism shall submit the
- 13 diagnostic assessment to the legislature, along with any
- 14 recommended proposed legislation.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
