A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that citizen
2	participation in elections is vital to the health and well-being
3	of a democratic and representative form of government. When the
4	citizenry opts out of its responsibility to vote, public
5	confidence and support of government is undermined, as is the
6	government's effectiveness in serving the people of the state.
7	In 2008, Hawaii had the lowest voter turnout in the United
8	States, with 50.6 per cent of eligible voters voting. Low voter
9	turnout is a significant concern that must be addressed. To
10	combat voter apathy, efforts to increase the percentage of
11	voting age citizens who are registered and to simplify the
12	voting process must be implemented.

- The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force to study and make recommendations on expanding voter registration methods and requiring mail-in ballots.
- 16 SECTION 2. There is established within the office of 17 elections a voter registration and participation task force that
- 18 shall consist of the following members:

2	(2)	A representative of the governor, designated by the

5		designated by the respective mayor;	
6	(4)	The county clerk of each county or the county clerk's

8	(5)	A representative from each political party as defined	
9		pursuant to section 11-61, designated by the	
10		respective party;	
11	(6)	A representative from the League of Women Voters,	
12		designated by the league;	
13	(7)	A member of the senate appointed by the senate

15	(8)	A member of the house of representatives appointed by	
16		the speaker of the house of representatives.	
17	SECT	ION 3. The members of the task force shall serve	
18	without compensation, but may be reimbursed for necessary travel		
19	expenses	incurred in the performance of official duties, if	
20	funds are available.		

SECTION 4. The office of elections shall provide all

necessary administrative and staff support for the task force.

15	force sha	ll submit a report on the task force's findings and	
16	recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the

20	force sha	ll cease to exist on June 1, 2010.
