#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding four new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§302B-A Base budget for charter school operations. (a)
5	The department shall determine the per-pupil allocation for
6	charter school operations by adding all other expenses to the
7	appropriation for charter schools, and dividing that sum by the
8	number of public school students including charter school
9	students projected to be enrolled for the upcoming school year.
10	For the purposes of this subsection, "all other expenses"
11	means the department's general fund appropriation for the
12	department's operations for the current fiscal year, minus the
13	following:
14	(1) State-level expenses, such as expenses relating to
15	collecting and reporting state-level data to federal
16	agencies and national organizations;
17	(2) Special education expenses;



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1	(3) Expenses relating to programs outside the kindergarten		
2	to grade twelve curriculum, such as the after-school		
3	plus program and adult education; and		
4	(4) Facility maintenance expenses.		
5	(b) Beginning with fiscal year 2009-2010, and each fiscal		
6	year thereafter, the base budget for charter school operations		
7	shall be the per-pupil allocation for charter school operations		
8	determined pursuant to subsection (a), multiplied by the total		
9	number of charter school students projected to be enrolled for		
10	the upcoming school year.		
11	(c) There is established within the department of		
12	education a committee to review and confirm the accuracy of the		
13	department's determination of the per-pupil allocation for		
14	charter school operations pursuant to subsection (a). The		
15	committee shall submit a report of its review to the		
16	superintendent of education and executive director of the		
17	office. If the committee determines that the per-pupil		
18	allocation for charter school operations is inaccurate pursuant		
19	to subsection (a), the department shall adjust the per-pupil		
20	allocation for charter school operations accordingly.		
21	(d) The composition of the committee shall be determined		
22	by the board of education based on recommendations from the

2	and shall	include:
3	(1)	Members with the appropriate professional skills,
4		experiences, and qualifications needed to facilitate
5		the work of the committee; and
6	(2)	Members who are representatives of the department and

9	(e)	The members of the committee shall serve at the
10	pleasure o	of the board of education and shall not be subject to
11	section 2	6-34. Members of the committee shall serve without
12	<u>compensat</u> :	ion but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
13	travel exp	penses, necessary for the performance of their duties.

18		student enrollment for the upcoming school year.
19	<u>§302</u>	B-D Base budget adjustments for start-up charter
20	school fa	cilities. (a) If the verified student enrollment for
21	the upcom	ing school year, as determined in September of each
22	year, exc	eeds the projected student enrollment used in

2	facilities pursuant to section 302B-C, the department shall
3	transfer sufficient funds to the office for distribution to the
4	charter schools. If the verified student enrollment for charter
5	schools is less than the projected student enrollment used in
6	determining the base budget for start-up charter school
7	facilities pursuant to section 302B-C, the office shall transfer
8	sufficient funds to the department.
9	(b) The base budgets for departmental school and
10	conversion charter school facilities, and for start-up charter
11	school facilities, if reduced, shall be reduced by the same
12	proportion."
13	SECTION 2. Section 302B-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
15	"(b) The executive director, under the direction of the
16	panel and in consultation with the charter schools, shall be
17	responsible for the internal organization, operation, and
18	management of the charter school system, including:
19	(1) Preparing and executing the budget for the charter
20	schools, including submission of the budget request to
21	the board, the governor, and the legislature;



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1	(2)	Allocating annual appropriations to the charter
2		schools pursuant to sections 302B-A to 302B-D, and
3		distribution of federal funds to charter schools;
4	(3)	Complying with applicable state laws related to the
5		administration of the charter schools;
6	(4)	Preparing contracts between the charter schools and
7		the department for centralized services to be provided
8		by the department;
9	(5)	Preparing contracts between the charter schools and
10		other state agencies for financial or personnel
11		services to be provided by the agencies to the charter
12		schools;
13	(6)	Providing independent analysis and recommendations on
14		charter school issues;
15	(7)	Representing charter schools and the charter school
16		system in communications with the board, the governor,
17		and the legislature;
18	(8)	Providing advocacy, assistance, and support for the
19		development, growth, progress, and success of charter
20		schools and the charter school system;
21	(9)	Providing guidance and assistance to charter
22		applicants and charter schools to enhance the



1		completeness and accuracy of information for panel
2		review;
3	(10)	Assisting charter applicants and charter schools in
4		coordinating their interactions with the panel as
5		needed;
6	(11)	Assisting the panel to coordinate with charter schools
7		in panel investigations and evaluations of charter
8		schools;
9	(12)	Serving as the conduit to disseminate communications
10		from the panel, the board, and the department to all
11		charter schools;
12	(13)	Determining charter school system needs and
13		communicating those needs to the panel, the board, and
14		the department;
15	(14)	Establishing a dispute resolution and mediation
16		process; and
17	(15)	Upon request by one or more charter schools, assisting
18		in the negotiation of a collective bargaining
19		agreement with the exclusive representative of its
20		employees."
21	SECT	ION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
22	1 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
