A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify Act 125,				
2	Session Laws of Hawaii 2008. The legislature intends that				
3	teachers who were hired prior to July 1, 2008, as emergency				
4	hires have four years as teachers to attain licensing.				
5	SECTION 2. Section 302A-804, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
6	amended to read as follows:				
7	"§302A-804 Powers and duties of the department. The				
8	department shall retain all of its rights and powers except for				
9	the authority provided to the board under this subpart. The				
10	department's powers and duties under this subpart shall be				
11	limited to:				
12	(1) Hiring, except in emergency situations as described in				
13	this chapter, licensed teachers to teach in their				
14	fields of licensing;				
15	(2) Reporting data annually to the board about the supply				
16	of, and demand for, teachers, including the				
17	identification of shortage areas, out-of-field				
18	teaching assignments, numbers of teachers teaching
