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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify Act 125,
 Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, by allowing unlicensed individuals
 hired on an emergency basis after June 30, 1997, but prior to
 July 1, 2008, to be employed as such for no more than four
 years, but requiring them to demonstrate active pursuit of
 licensing in each year of employment.

7 SECTION 2. Section 302A-804, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows:

9 "\$302A-804 Powers and duties of the department. The
10 department shall retain all of its rights and powers except for
11 the authority provided to the board under this subpart. The
12 department's powers and duties under this subpart shall be
13 limited to:
