H.B. NO. 1733

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTEREST.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide for the
 temporary transfer into the general fund of interest earned on
 short-term investment or deposit of moneys of certain special
 funds, revolving funds, and special accounts.

5 This Act does not require the temporary transfer of any fee 6 or user charge collected from a beneficiary of a state service. 7 It only provides for the temporary transfer of interest earned 8 on the unexpended fee or charge. Thus, the legislature intends 9 that this Act be in conformance with state judicial 10 interpretation concerning the proper use of the proceeds from a 11 fee or user charge established by a state agency.

SECTION 2. Temporary transfer of interest earned on certain special funds, revolving funds, and special accounts to general fund. (a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, from July 1, 2009, until June 30, 2015, the director of finance shall deposit into the general fund the interest earned on the short-term investment of moneys of the special funds, revolving funds, and special accounts listed in this HB LRB 09-0577-1.doc

Provides for the temporary transfer of interest from certain special funds, revolving funds, and special accounts to the general fund.
