#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FUNDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal the
2	provision	s that except certain special funds from assessments
3	for centr	al service and departmental administrative expenses.
4	The	legislature finds that the exceptions from the
5	assessmen	ts for the following special funds should be retained:
6	(1)	The Hawaii hurricane relief fund because, under
7		current statute, all interest earned on moneys in the
8		fund is already transferred to the general fund;
9	(2)	The convention center enterprise special fund and
10		tourism special fund because a portion of the
11		transient accommodations tax, the revenue source for
12		those special funds, already is transmitted to the
13		general fund; and
14	(3)	The tourism special fund.
15	SECT	ION 2. Section 21D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:

The department is authorized to hire employees necessary to staff its out-of-state offices subject to 16 17 chapter 76 and legislative appropriations. The department may also appoint such other employees exempt from chapter 76 as may 18 be necessary to administer the affairs of its out-of-state 19 20 offices. The initial appointment shall not exceed three years, during which time the department shall submit to the legislature 21 a request for approval prior to continuation of the position. To carry out the purposes and objectives of 9 the research corporation, including the conduct of research and 10 training projects, the research corporation shall be granted 11 flexibility in hiring its personnel and in handling and 12 disbursing moneys by being excepted from the following state 13 laws: [(1) Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund 14 15 reimbursements to the state general fund; 16 (2) (1) Chapter 103D, relating to advertising for bids and 17 purchases to be made in Hawaii whenever public moneys are expended; 18 19  $\left[\frac{(3)}{(2)}\right]$  (2) Chapter 76, relating to civil service; and [(4)] (3) Section 78-1, relating to public employment." 20 21 SECTION 7. Section 342D-82, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 22 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: HB LRB 09-0395-2.doc

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1 SECTION 8. Section 261D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 repealed.

6 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009 and 9 shall be repealed on June 30, 2015; provided that sections 21D-5, 36-27, 36-30, 201-85, 304A-3005, 342D-82, and 261D-3, 10 Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which 11 they read on June 30, 2009. 12
