A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SALARY INCREASES FOR TEACHERS AND EDUCATIONAL OFFICERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal the 2 statutory provision that provides teachers and educational 3 officers of the department of education with annual increments 4 or other longevity step increases. Salary increases and step movements are negotiated with both teachers and educational 5 officers pursuant to chapter 89-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and 6 7 therefore provisions relating to annual increments and step 8 increases are no longer necessary.

9 SECTION 2. Section 302A-622, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended to read as follows:

12 for teachers of the department shall be subject to the
13 requirements of [sections 302A-624 and 302A-626] section 302A14 624 and shall be as follows:

SECTION 3. Section 302A-623, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

"[4]§302A-623[4] Salary ranges, educational officers.
Salary ranges for educational officer positions of the
department shall be determined by the board based on the
position classification/compensation plan approved by the board.
Salary ranges for educational officer positions shall be subject
to the requirements of [sections 302A-625 and 302A-626] section
<u>302A-625</u>."

20 SECTION 4. Section 302A-703, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21 amended to read as follows:

Salary ranges and salary incentives for educational officer 1 2 positions shall be subject to the requirements of [sections 302A-625 and 302A-626] section 302A-625." 3 SECTION 5. Section 302A-626, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 repealed. 6 [#\$302A-626 Salary increases; annual, longevity. (a) Teachers and educational officers who have completed a year's 7 8 satisfactory service and who have complied with the other 9 requirements of sections 302A-602 to 302A-640, and 302A-701, 10 shall be entitled to an annual increment. 11 (b) Teachers and educational officers who have served 12 satisfactorily for three years in their maximum increment step or in any longevity step and who have complied with the other 13 14 requirements of sections 302A-602 to 302A-640, and 302A-701, 15 shall receive longevity step increases; provided that the board 16 may grant principals and vice-principals longevity step 17 increases more frequently than once every three years pursuant to section 302A-625."] 18 19 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 21

Description:

Repeals the statutory provisions that provide teachers and educational officers with annual incremental or longevity step increases.
