A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	DEPARTMENT OF TOURISM
6	§ -1 Definitions. The following definitions, whenever
7	used in this chapter, shall have the following respective
8	meanings, unless a different meaning clearly appears in the
9	context:
10	"Department" means the department of tourism.
11	"Director" means the director of tourism.
12	§ -2 General powers and duties of the department. (a)
13	The department of tourism shall have general charge, oversight,
14	and care of tourism and related activities in the State. It
15	shall be the objective of the department to promote activities
16	that support, maintain, and expand the state's domestic and

- visitor expenditures, tax revenue, and employment.
- 3 § -3 Tourism-related activities. (a) The department
- 4 may enter into contracts and agreements that include the
- 5 following:
- 6 (1) Tourism promotion, marketing, and development;
- 7 (2) Market development-related research;
- 8 (3) Product development and diversification issues focused
- 9 on visitors;
- 10 (4) Promotion, development, and coordination of sports-
- 11 related activities and events;
- 12 (5) Promotion of Hawaii, through a coordinated statewide
- effort, as a place to do business, including high
- 14 technology business, and as a business destination;
- 15 (6) Reduction of barriers to travel;
- 16 (7) Marketing, management, use, operation, or maintenance
- of the convention center facility, including the
- 18 purchase or sale of goods or services, logo items,
- 19 concessions, sponsorships, and license agreements, or
- 20 any use of the convention center facility as a
- 21 commercial enterprise; provided that effective
- January 1, 2003, and thereafter the contract for

1	management of the convention center facility shall
2	include marketing for all uses of the facility; and
3	(8) Any and all other activities necessary to carry out
4	the intent of this chapter;
5	provided that for any contract or agreement valued at \$25,000
6	and over, the director shall provide notice to the speaker of
7	the house of representatives and the president of the senate on
8	the same day that such notification is given to the governor.
9	(b) The director may delegate to staff the responsibility
10	for soliciting, awarding, and executing contracts, and
11	monitoring and facilitating any and all functions developed in
12	accordance with subsection (a)."
13	§ -4 Convention center enterprise special fund. (a)
14	There is established the convention center enterprise special
15	fund, into which shall be deposited:
16	(1) A portion of the revenues from the transient
17	accommodations tax, as provided by section 237D-6.5;
18	(2) All revenues or moneys derived from the operations of
19	the convention center to include all revenues from th
20	food and beverage service, all revenues from the
21	parking facilities or from any concession, and all
22	revenues from the sale of souvenirs, logo items, or

1		any other items offered for purchase at the convention
2		center;
3	(3)	Private contributions, interest, compensation, gross
4		or net revenues, proceeds, or other moneys derived
5		from any source or for any purpose arising from the
6		use of the convention center facility; and
7	(4)	Any appropriations by the legislature, including any
8		transfers from the tourism special fund established
9		under section -6.
10	(b)	Moneys in the convention center enterprise special
11	fund shall	l be used by the department of tourism for the payment
12	of any and	d all debt service relating to the convention center,
13	any expens	se arising from any and all use, operation,
14	maintenand	ce, alteration, improvement, or any unforeseen or
15	unplanned	repairs of the convention center, including without
16	limitation	n the food and beverage service and parking service
17	provided a	at the convention center facility, the sale of
18	souvenirs,	logo items, or other items, for any future major
19	repair, ma	aintenance, and improvement of the convention center
20	facility a	as a commercial enterprise or as a world class facility
21	for conver	ntions, entertainment, or public events, and for
22	marketing	the facility.

20	measures t	to respond to any tourism emergency, upon declaration
21	by the gov	vernor that a tourism emergency exists that adversely
22	affects Ha	waii's tourism industry by resulting in a substantial

2	SECT	ION 6. Section 237D-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
4	"(b)	Revenues collected under this chapter shall be
5	distribut	ed as follows, with the excess revenues to be deposited
6	into the	general fund:
7	(1)	17.3 per cent of the revenues collected under this
8		chapter shall be deposited into the convention center

9	be transferred to a sub-account in the tourism special
10	fund to provide funding for a safety and security
11	budget, in accordance with the Hawaii tourism
12	strategic plan 2005-2015; provided further that of the
13	revenues remaining in the tourism special fund after
14	revenues have been deposited as provided in this
15	paragraph and except for any sum authorized by the
16	legislature for expenditure from revenues subject to
17	this paragraph, beginning July 1, 2007, funds shall be
18	deposited into the tourism emergency trust fund,
19	established in section $[\frac{201B-10}{}]$ 5, in a manner
20	sufficient to maintain a fund balance of \$5,000,000 in
21	the tourism emergency trust fund; and

1	(3) 44.8 per cent of the revenues collected under this
2	chapter shall be transferred as follows: Kauai count
3	shall receive 14.5 per cent, Hawaii county shall
4	receive 18.6 per cent, city and county of Honolulu
5	shall receive 44.1 per cent, and Maui county shall
6	receive 22.8 per cent.
7	All transient accommodations taxes shall be paid into the
8	state treasury each month within ten days after collection and
9	shall be kept by the state director of finance in special
10	accounts for distribution as provided in this subsection."
11	SECTION 7. Chapter 201B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	repealed.
13	SECTION 8. All moneys currently in the convention center
14	enterprise special fund, the tourism emergency trust fund, and
15	the tourism special fund shall be transferred with each
16	respective fund established pursuant to section 1 of this Act.
17	SECTION 9. Any contractual obligations entered into by the
18	Hawaii tourism authority shall cease upon repeal of chapter
19	201B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and any unexpended contractual
20	funds shall lapse to the convention center enterprise special
21	fund, tourism special fund, or the tourism emergency trust fund,
22	correspondingly, as established by this Act.

- 1 SECTION 10. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 2 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 3 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 4 acquired, or held by the Hawaii tourism authority relating to
- 5 the functions transferred to the department of tourism shall be
- 6 transferred with the functions to which they relate.
- 7 SECTION 11. This Act does not affect rights and duties
- 8 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 9 were begun, before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 12. In codifying the new sections added by
- 11 section 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 12 appropriate section numbers for the numbers used in designating
- 13 the new sections in this Act.
- 14 SECTION 13. The revisor of statutes shall replace the term
- 15 "department of business, economic development, and tourism" or
- 16 like term, as appropriate, whenever it may appear in the Hawaii
- 17 Revised Statutes, with the term "department of business and
- 18 economic development".
- 19 SECTION 14. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
