#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SALARIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Article XVI, section 3.5, of the
 Hawaii Constitution, salaries for certain members of the
 judicial, executive, and legislative branches "established
 pursuant to this section shall not be decreased during a term of
 office, unless by general law applying to all salaried officers
 of the State."

7 SECTION 2. Section 26-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 "§26-51 Governor; lieutenant governor. Effective at noon on December 4, 2006, the salaries of the governor and the 10 lieutenant governor shall be as last recommended by the 11 executive salary commission. Effective July 1, 2007, and every 12 13 six years thereafter, the salaries of the governor and 14 lieutenant governor shall be as last recommended by the 15 commission on salaries pursuant to section 26-56, unless 16 rejected by the legislature. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the 17 current salaries of the governor and the lieutenant governor, as of January 2, 2009, shall be reduced by five per cent, effective 18 HB HMS 2009-1632

8 The commission shall not review the salary of any position9 in the department of education or the University of Hawaii.

10 The commission may recommend different salaries for department heads and executive officers and different salary 11 12 ranges for deputies or assistants to department heads; provided 13 that the commission shall recommend the same salary range for 14 deputies or assistants to department heads within the same 15 department; provided further that the appointing official shall 16 specify the salary for a particular position within the 17 applicable range.

18 The commission shall not recommend salaries lower than
19 salary amounts recommended by prior commissions replaced by this
20 section.

(c) The commission may seek assistance from the department
of human resources development and any other agency in



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conducting its review, and all agencies shall fully cooperate
 with the commission and provide any necessary information to the
 commission upon request.

4 The commission shall convene in the month of November (d) 5 2006, and every six years thereafter. Not later than the 6 fortieth legislative day of the regular session of 2007, and 7 every six years thereafter, the commission shall submit a report 8 of its findings and its salary recommendations to the legislature, through the governor. The commission may include 9 10 incremental increases that take effect prior to the convening of the next salary commission. 11

12 The recommended salaries submitted by the commission shall 13 become effective on July 1 of the next fiscal year unless the 14 legislature disapproves the recommended salaries submitted by 15 the commission through the adoption of a concurrent resolution, which shall be approved by a simple majority of each house of 16 the legislature, prior to adjournment sine die of the 17 18 legislative session in which the recommended salaries are 19 submitted; provided that any change in salary which becomes effective shall not apply to the legislature to which the 20 21 recommendation for the change in salary was submitted.



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1	The governor shall include the salary amounts recommended
2	by the commission and approved by the legislature for employees
3	of the executive branch in the executive budget. If the salary
4	amounts recommended by the commission are disapproved by the
5	legislature, the commission shall reconvene in the November next
6	following the legislative disapproval to review the
7	legislature's reasons for disapproving its salary
8	recommendation. The commission may submit a report of its
9	findings and submit a new salary recommendation to the
10	legislature at the next regular session. The commission's
11	reconvening following a legislative disapproval shall not toll
12	the six-year cycle.

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(c) In computing the compensation of a judge, the
 compensation paid to the judge by the United States as well as

4 For service rendered as a member of the legislature (d) 5 from and after November 5, 1968, the actual annual salary of a member shall be the only amount used for determining the 6 7 member's average final compensation. For service rendered as a 8 member of the legislature prior to November 5, 1968, and after 9 admission of this State into the Union, the annual compensation 10 of a member shall be computed, for the purpose of determining 11 the member's average final compensation, as follows: during a 12 year in which a general session was held, it shall be deemed to have been an amount equal to four times the salary of a member 13 14 of the legislature for a general session; and during a year in 15 which a budget session was held, it shall be deemed to have been 16 an amount equal to six times the salary of a member of the 17 legislature for a budget session. For service rendered as a 18 member of the legislature prior to the admission of this State 19 into the Union, the annual compensation of a member shall be 20 deemed to have been four times the salary of a member of the legislature for a regular session for each year during the 21 member's term of office. 22



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If a member has credited service rendered as an 1 (e) 2 elective officer or as a legislative officer, the member's 3 average final compensation shall be computed separately for each category of service as follows: 4 For the three [highest paid] highest-paid years of 5 (1) credited service as an elective officer, or if the 6 member has less than three years of credited service 7 in that capacity, then the member's actual years of 8 credited service: 9 (2) For the three [highest paid] highest-paid years of 10 credited service as a legislative officer, or if the 11 member has less than three years of credited service 12 in that capacity, then the member's actual years of 13 credited service; 14 (3) For the three [highest paid] highest paid years of 15 16 credited service as a judge, or if the member has less 17 than three years of credited service in that capacity, then the member's actual years of credited service; 18 19 and 20 (4) For the three [highest paid] highest-paid years of

credited service not included in paragraph (1), (2),

or (3), or if the member has less than three years of
