A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COGNITIVE RESTRUCTURING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a
disproportionately high rate of arrest and incarceration among
young men and women of Hawaiian ancestry. Many of these
individuals are under forty years of age and should be provided
rehabilitation opportunities.

6 A promising approach to reducing recidivism and helping 7 inmates make the successful transition from prison to the 8 community is cognitive restructuring and transition programs 9 provided at correctional facilities. Such programs involve 10 self-examination of an inmate's belief system, criminal 11 addictive cycle, attitudes and thinking patterns, and 12 development of relapse prevention plans for future situations. 13 The program assists offenders in restructuring their thought 14 processes and teaches cognitive skills that help with basic 15 decision-making and problem-solving. The goal of cognitive 16 restructuring is to guide offenders to consciously examine their 17 own thoughts by engaging in processes that develop self-control, 18 thus making them responsible for, and in charge of, their HB1818 HD1 HMS 2010-1870

actions no matter how stressful the situation. When combined
with strategies that help Hawaiian inmates get back in touch
with the values of their culture, cognitive rehabilitation can
help break the vicious cycle of crime and punishment, as
knowledge of Hawaiian traditions and cultural values have helped
many cope with social challenges.

7 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that 8 reentry/reintegration programs within Hawaii's correctional 9 facilities offer cognitive behavioral therapy with native 10 Hawaiian holistic interventions to address domestic violence, 11 addictions, self mastery through identity, and community 12 connections to promote the successful transition from 13 incarceration to the community.

14 SECTION 2. (a) The department of public safety shall 15 ensure that reentry/reintegration programs within Hawaii's 16 correctional facilities offer cognitive behavioral therapy with 17 native Hawaiian holistic interventions to address domestic 18 violence, addictions, self mastery through identity, and 19 community connections to promote the successful transition from 20 incarceration to the community.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this Act, or the
application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the
invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
