RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§132D- Fireworks surcharge. (a) There is levied and 5 assessed at the wholesale and retail levels on every sale of 6 consumer fireworks made pursuant to this chapter, a fireworks 7 surcharge equal to per cent of the amount collected from 8 the sale. 9 Payment of the surcharge to the State shall be the 10 responsibility of persons licensed under section 132D-7 who sell 11 consumer fireworks. 12 (b) The department of taxation shall prescribe necessary 13 forms and may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to administer 14 and effectuate this section." 15 SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending the definition of "cultural" to read as 16
