A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PREAUDITS FOR PROPOSED PAYMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that like the University 2 of Hawaii, the department of education should be required to 3 preaudit all proposed payments of \$10,000 or more, but should have preaudit flexibility for proposed payments of less than 4 5 \$10,000. The legislature also finds that the fiscal autonomy previously granted to the University of Hawaii and the 6 7 department of education until June 30, 2011, should be extended. 8 The purpose of this Act is to: 9 (1) Clarify that the department of education is required

10 to preaudit proposed payments of \$10,000 or more; 11 Allow the University of Hawaii and the department of (2)12 education to preaudit sample populations for proposed 13 payments of less than \$10,000 to determine the 14 propriety of expenditures and compliance with 15 applicable laws, executive orders, and rules, as their 16 respective chief financial officers determine to be 17 appropriate; and

1 Extend the date until which the University of Hawaii (3) 2 and the department of education shall have autonomous 3 authority over their accounting systems and other 4 purchasing responsibilities and duties. 5 SECTION 2. Section 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 7 "(b) With respect to the executive branch, except the 8 University of Hawaii until [June 30, 2011,] June 30, 2015, the 9 Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of education until 10 [June 30, 2011,] June 30, 2015, the comptroller shall have 11 complete supervision of all accounts. The comptroller shall 12 preaudit all proposed payments of \$10,000 or more to determine 13 the propriety of expenditures and compliance with executive 14 orders and rules that may be in effect. When necessary, the comptroller shall withhold approval of any payment. 15 Whenever 16 approval is withheld, the department or agency concerned shall 17 be promptly notified. With respect to the University of Hawaii, 18 the Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of education, 19 the comptroller shall issue warrants for the release of funds 20 for the operating costs of the university, the Hawaii tourism 21 authority, or the department of education, as applicable, in 22 amounts and at times mutually agreed upon by the governor or 2010-0315 HB SMA.doc



1 director of finance and the university, the Hawaii tourism 2 authority, or department of education, as applicable; provided: 3 (1) The amounts released shall not exceed the allotment 4 ceilings for the respective funding sources of the university's or the department of education's 5 6 appropriations established by the governor for an 7 allotment period pursuant to section 37-34, or in the 8 case of the Hawaii tourism authority, revenues 9 received by the convention center enterprise special 10 fund and the tourism special fund pursuant to section 11 237D-6.5; and

12 (2)The comptroller may issue warrants as an advance from 13 the state treasury to the University of Hawaii, the 14 Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of 15 education to establish a checking account and provide 16 working capital in amounts and at times mutually 17 agreed upon by the governor or director of finance and 18 the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism 19 authority, and the department of education. 20 The University of Hawaii and the department of education shall preaudit all proposed payments of \$10,000 or more and [the] 21

6	department of education] shall preaudit all proposed payments to
7	determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance with
8	applicable laws, executive orders, and rules as may be in
9	effect. The University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority,
10	and the department of education shall make disbursements for
11	operating expenses from the amounts released by the comptroller
12	and maintain records and documents necessary to support those
13	disbursements at times mutually agreed upon by the university
14	president, the executive director of the Hawaii tourism
15	authority, or the superintendent of education, as applicable,
16	and the comptroller; provided that when requested by the
17	university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
18	education, the comptroller shall make all disbursements for the
19	university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
20	education, as applicable, subject to available allotment. Funds
21	released pursuant to this section shall be deposited by the
22	university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
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education, as applicable, in accordance with the provisions 1 . 2 applicable to the director of finance by chapter 38. Except for 3 moneys deposited by the Hawaii tourism authority in the 4 convention center enterprise special fund pursuant to section 5. 201B-8, and in the tourism special fund pursuant to section 6 201B-11, any interest earned on the deposit of funds released 7 pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the state 8 treasury at the end of each fiscal year." 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2010; 12 provided that the amendments made to section 40-1, Hawaii 13 Revised Statutes, by this Act shall not be repealed when section 14 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is repealed and reenacted on 15 June 30, 2010 by section 12 of Act 5, Special Session Laws of 16 Hawaii 2009.
