A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§712-A Solicitation of prostitution near schools or
5	public parks. (1) A person commits the offense of solicitation
6	of prostitution near schools or public parks if, within seven
7	hundred fifty feet of the real property comprising a school or a
8	public park, the person offers or agrees to pay a fee to another
9	person to engage in sexual conduct.
10	(2) A person who violates this section shall be guilty of
11	a misdemeanor.
12	(3) For purposes of this section:
13	(a) "School" has the same meaning as in section
14	712 - 1249.6(6); and
15	(b) "Sexual conduct" has the same meaning as in section
16	<u>712-1200(2).</u> "

3	A conviction for purposes of this section is a judgment on the

8	expunged by pardon, reversed, or set aside.
9	(3) Habitual solicitation of prostitution is a

11	SECTION 3. Act 192, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is
12	amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:
13	"SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,
14	and shall be repealed on June 30, [2010.] <u>2012.</u> "
15	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

Report Title: Prostitution

Description:

Establishes the offense of solicitation of prostitution near schools or public parks, which makes it a misdemeanor to offer or agree to pay a fee to engage in sexual conduct within 750 feet of a school or public park, and adds this offense to those solicitation offenses for which a person may attain the status of "habitual prostitution offender" if the person has two or more convictions within a ten-year period. Extends the "sunset" date of Act 192, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, which makes habitual solicitation of prostitution a criminal offense, to June 30, 2012. Effective September 14, 2047. (SD1)
